### FIRST ACCIDENT IN MANY YEARS

**S. M. Hawk, Who Has Long Been in Sawmill Business Meets With First Accident—May Lose Sight in One Eye.**

After thirty-five years of experience as a saw mill man, S. M. Hawk, who now operates a mill at Prospect and one at Peyton, has just suffered his first accident, and in consequence may lose the sight of one of his eyes.

Mr. Hawk is engaged in cutting timber for the Prospect Construction Company. He was testing his mill when the governor's belt flew off letting the mill start so fast that a piece of wood split off a pulley and struck Mr. Hawk on the right eye and forehead. A splinter entered the eyeball and he may lose the sight in that eye.

### WANT COUNTY FIRE WARDEN

A petition is being circulated by E. I. Shannon, secretary of the Jackson County Fire Patrol association, asking that the county court appoint a fire warden to act in conjunction with the present fire patrolmen, of which there are now seven, all being paid by members of the association.

The seven men now employed are working in the Butte Falls, Prospect and Trail Creek country. Each of the men have had assigned to them, certain blocks of timber as their especial patrol, and when new patrolmen are added other blocks of timber are set apart for their especial attention.

By this method of constant patrol the timbermen hope to reduce the fire loss materially.
