

TO SAN DEIGO ON MOTORCYCLES

Two Portland Youths Reach Medford On Unique Vacation Trip—Rough Ride Over the Umpquas—Plan Side Trips to Famous Resorts.

M. J. Jones of Portland, who two years ago worked for the Tribune in Medford as printer and Clyde Sheets, also of Portland, spent the day here Wednesday en route to San Diego Cal., upon a unique vacation trip. They are making the journey mounted upon motor cycles, and report a rough trip between Cottage Grove and Grants Pass.

Many interesting side trips are planned for the trip, one of which is to Crater lake on the return trip and another probably will take them to Yosemite valley. The tourists may decide to pilot their motor cycles across the international boundary line into Old Mexico.

Jones last year went from Portland to Seattle and Tacoma on his motorcycle and has had touring experience on this type of motor. Both lads are members of the Portland Motorcycle club. Sheets is a well known Portland athlete, being a star basketball player and high jumper. Jones is employed by a Portland photograph establishment and will try to get a number of snap shots for use in adorning the Portland Motorcycle club's new home.

Although it was the original intention of the boys to return home by August 1, it seems likely that it will be several days later before they steer their machines back to the starting point. The route chosen for the first half of the trip is via Sacramento valley, but, conditions being favorable they will return by the coast route into Oregon.

LOCAL CONCERN NOW SELLS POLES

For many Years All Electric Light, Telephone and Telegraph Poles Have Been Shipped In—Change is Now Being Made in Matter.

If the lumber owners of Jackson county could have realized the purchase price of all the telephone, telegraph and electric light poles which have been used in the county for the past ten or twelve years their bank accounts would have profited materially. Never has there been any part of this industry taken care of here, notwithstanding the fact that all the timbered sections of the county is liberally sprinkled with a splendid quality of cedar trees.

The completion and operation of the Pacific & Eastern railroad into Butte Falls has made the opening up of this cedar pole industry a possibility and the opportunity is being taken advantage of by Manager Hafer of the Crater Lake Lumber company who has large holdings in the Butte Falls section.

Mr. Hafer states that the output of this industry, so far as his company is concerned, is limited only by the demand. The company has already supplied the Rogue River Electric company with two carloads of 40-foot poles for use in its Prospect power transmission line.

The company will soon carry a supply of poles in Medford and will have in lengths from 25 to 40 feet.

PRIMROSE, THE MINSTREL, SUES WIFE FOR DIVORCE
