BUTTE FALLS ITEMS.

Uncle Ben Edmondson and his son Charles are in the valley. John Swanson has gone down to Medford on business. He reports times quick in the Falls. The saw mill has closed down and will install new water wheel and do other needed repairs. Capp Mahney is down to Medford attending his land claim contest. C. O. Baker and wife are visiting Medford in the interest of Mrs. Baker's land claim which is being contested. Messrs Jeffries and Downing of the unsurveyed lands are in attendance before the United States commissioner, their homesteads being contested. Mr. Bassett has built an addition to Bill Matthews store and opened a shoemaker shop. Many of the mill men are leaving as there is not work for them. Several of the names on the petition for incorporation are the names of persons who have been temporary residents of the town and who have left for other climes. It is generally believed that interests of Medford and Jacksonville are behind the incorporation movement and that an effort is being made to build up a political machine and introduce influences adverse to the best development of the town. The office of Judge Pentz is at present vacant and for rent. This is a nice building adapted to ice cream, cigar, millinery and the racket business, the Pine Belt Banking Company has charge of it. J. P. Hughes is doing a fine business and constantly adding to his store attractions. Some complaint is made that more than soft drinks are sold in some of our stores. The Satchel Merchant had better look out as he is well known and his work recognized. There is need of a legal administration and enforcement of law in our midst as many parties are defiant of law and order. The Presbyterian people are still hoping to erect their church building this year, but those who should help and render assistance are somewhat "grouchy" and it is either rule or rain policy for them. The town should keep in mind that necessary arrangements for sewerage, public buildings and water supply and many other requirements are essential to the proper growth and development of its interests and that much money must be furnished to supply and pay for those conveniences. A bonded indebtedness means the mortgaging of every home and all property within the proposed lines of incorporation and once saddle the town with a debt it will be a continuous burden. It takes men of financial ability to manage corporate affairs and good, hard common sense to run municipal affairs. Butte Falls has not the required financial ability neither the men to undertake such tasks, and it is not right to burden the people at this time. They are not ready or able to undertake the work. If Butte Falls Lumber Company would take a less selfish view of conditions and work in harmony with the community disposition to develop and aid in the growth and upbuilding of our town and offer suitable inducements to outside capital and industries and lose right of speculative features, it would not be long before the class of men and the kind of enterprises making for the material growth and continuous property of Butte Falls would be in evidence more than at present. We understand that Bert Harris who has formerly managed our mill in Klamath county connected with a "kerry go round business." Bert is O. K. and many wish him back here.

ORDINANCE NO. 528.

Section 1. That it is hereby declared that the establishment and maintenance of a livery barn or

stable, boarding or sale stable within one hundred feet of any building in said city occupied in whole or in part by any school, church, hotel or social club organized under the laws of the State of Oregon shall be and constitute a nuisance.

Section 2. The establishment and maintenance of a livery barn or stable, boarding or sale stable within one hundred feet of any building occupied in whole or in part by any school, church, hotel or social club, organized under the laws of the State of Oregon, is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor and the same is hereby prohibited. Section 3. The maintenance of any such livery barn or stable boarding or sale stable which has heretofore or may hereafter be lawfully established and maintained shall not be rendered unlawful by reason of any church, school, hotel or social club thereafter entering into the occupancy in whole or in part of any building within one hundred feet thereof. Section 4. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not more than fifty dollars or be imprisoned for not more than fifty days. Section 5. Whereas, the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the public is about to be impaired by the opening of certain livery stables an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the mayor.
