**LIBERAL SUPPLY OF BEEF CATTLE**

**Prices Go Off to Small Extent—Hogs Advance Owing to Small Offering—Many Shipped In From the East Cattle Specials Operated.**

**PORTRALD**, July 24.—Receipts for the week there 2177 cattle; 317 calves; 1408 hogs; 8598 sheep; 159 goats.

The cattle market showed a more liberal supply than in some little time and prices may be said to have gone off 25. This applies to both cows and steers. Some of the sellers claim that extra good quality steers would have brought \$6.25, the top of the week before, but generally considered, the market is 25 cents lower. Calves sold at full 25 cents lower, while at the lower market prices cattle are easily \$1.00 higher than any other market in the United States.

A large volume of arrivals in the sheep division had a tendency to take the market down. Lambs that sold at \$5.75 were easily in the \$6.00 quality of the previous week. A greater part of the arrivals were not in the mutton class and some of them went out as feeders.

In the hog division the market advanced 25 cents. There was very few local hogs, the majority of the receipts having been made up of eastern shipments.

Subject of interest to the shippers from Idaho and Montana, is a special stock train on the Oregon Short Line leaving Pocatello Sundays and Thursdays to connect with the O. W. R. & N. special livestock trains from Huntington. This will enable shippers from Montana and Idaho points to put their livestock on the market on definite days.
