YOUNG CYCLER BADLY INJURED

Frank Emerick Hurlled From Motor Cycle, Striking Against Railroad Tie - Operation Necessary - Injuries While Painful, Not Serious.

Frank Emerick was seriously injured Tuesday afternoon at the race track, when he was hurled from his motorcycle, his hip striking the end of a railroad tie. The bones in his hip were splintered. He was rushed to the hospital and is now resting easily. The injuries, though serious, are not believed to be necessarily fatal.

Emerick is a motorcycle driver and racer of much experience. Tuesday he had just received a new make of cycle and was testing it out. He was attempting to lower the track record when injured. Rounding a curve, he did not slow his engine and the machine left the track.

10,000 BARREL GUSHER STRUCK IN CALIFORNIA

Bakersfield, Cal., July 26. - Heliatic reports were received here today that a 10,000-barrel gusher had been discovered in the Lost Hills country in northern Kern county. A frantic call for steamers and shovellers has been sent to nearby properties and an effort will be made to throw up a levee and save the product.

BRYAN STILL LEADS NEBRASKA DEMOCRACY

Fremont, Neb., July 26. - That William J. Bryan is still a power in Nebraska democracy was evident today. Bryan's domination of the party was made clear at yesterday's convention, when all efforts of the Omaha delegation to force resolutions denouncing Bryan and endorsing the presidential candidacy of Governor Harmon of Ohio were defeated. The up-state delegates demanded that harmony reign in the convention and ran the steam roller over Bryan's opponents, forcing through a peace program.

CHISHOLM SUSPECTED OF WHOLESALE MURDER

Santa Rosa, Cal., July 26. - Suspected of murder of 16 women and with strong evidence against him in at least one case—that of Minna Passi, Dr. L. C. Chisholm, convicted murderer of John D. Powell, may be taken from Folsom prison, where he is now serving a life sentence, to stand trial for other crimes. Sixteen women are known to have been associated with Chisholm in the past four years and most of them disappeared mysteriously.
