The bulk from the Sacramento river and Suisun are undersized and all poor quality and they sold today from \$2.30 to \$2.50. Buyers are waiting for the regular size, well matured Bartletts which we should have here within 10 days. Good Bartletts will continue to command good prices; we feel confident and we urge our friends to ship. Fifty boxes of elegant large size sold today at \$4.00.

Peaches—Market holds strong. Early Crawford, bulk of arrivals selling \$1.50 to \$1.25 per box. Georgia entirely ended and Arkansas virtually so. If you have good peaches, let us have some.

Plums—Market a little lower, excepting Tragedies \$2.00 to \$1.65 and they are about ended. Wicksons, best, \$2.10 to \$1.65; others \$1.50 to \$1.25. Burbank \$1.50 to \$1.30. Purple Dunes, \$1.30 to \$1.15. Italian prunes, today, would sell \$1.60 to \$1.80 per crate.
