

MANY PRESENTS FOR THE EAGLES

Delegates and Visitors to Grand Aerial Session to Be Loaded Down With Gifts—All Kinds of Fruit to Be Showered Upon Them.

The delegates and visitors who come to San Francisco for the thirteenth grand aerial session of the Fraternal Order of Eagles will be obliged to order extra trunks if they take to their homes one-half of the gifts that will be showered upon them by bounteous California, says the Examiner.

Baskets of oranges, apples, figs, plums, cherries, both fresh and preserved, olives, grapes, raisins, almonds, bottles of oil from the south coast from the Imperial valley, wine of all varieties from every section of the state, grain and the by-products, and the scores of products and manufactures of California will be distributed with lavish hand.

"California day," Tuesday, August 22, will see every county in the state keeping open house for the visitors and dispensing their favors with a generous hand. The Contra Costa aerial will have general headquarters in the Palace hotel, and there 10,000 gallons of choice wine will be given away.

Los will send 25,000 baskets of fruit, and the Sacramento valley aeries have joined hands to give a variety of good things to every visitor that calls at their headquarters in the Palace hotel. Los Angeles, San Bernardino and Santa Barbara will give away tropical fruits, and every county in the state will have something to offer.

The delegations are coming in a manner befitting the luxury and magnificence of the east. Kansas City will have two special trains, and the first of these will be the finest special train that has ever been sent to any convention. From New York there will be a big train in two sections. Milwaukee will have a train bearing their boasted drill teams. Boston, St. Louis, St. Paul and Minneapolis and scores of small cities are sending special trains.

LAFFERTY WROTE PORTLAND GIRLS

Congressman Tried to Pursue Stenographer by Same Methods That He Used With Washington School Girl—Also Insulted Woman.

The Portland Oregonian of August 9 prints a facsimile of a letter addressed to a Portland girl by Congressman A. W. Lafferty before his election, which reads as follows:

January 22, 1910.

Dear Miss _____ City.
One night not long ago I was standing talking to my brother, a general delivery clerk, when you called for your mail, and I liked your looks very much. If you will call me up, M. 8400 or drop in to see me when you are down town, I should be glad to make your acquaintance. I heard you were a typewriter, and if so, I can give you a good position. I guess you will think from the way this letter is written I need a stenographer. Don't say anything to my brother about this.

Got Phone Number.

The name of the girl addressed is withheld. Continuing the Oregonian states:

In a mysterious way, which cannot be explained by the young woman and her friends, Lafferty obtained the number of the telephone at the residence where she was visiting and a few days after mailing the letter called her up. On this occasion Lafferty renewed his urgent invitation that the young woman call at his office that he might become acquainted with her and at the same time provide a "good position" for her.

Phoned Several Times.

Although the girl treated Lafferty civilly in the conversation she told him plainly that she did not care to meet him. But this did not serve to repulse Lafferty who, a day or two later, again called the young woman to the telephone. This interview was

decidedly brief, Lafferty being told that if he did not immediately desist in his attempts to enforce his attentions on the young woman she would be obliged to acquaint her parents with the circumstances. With this threat Lafferty quit.

This is not the only letter-writing experience Lafferty is said to have had in Portland.

Married Woman Insulted.

Lafferty's public attentions to a young married woman three years ago almost caused his arrest. In fact, he was taken in custody by a policeman whom the young woman had summoned to her aid because of Lafferty and undergo the notoriety that would ensue.

POPE URGED TO CALL CONSISTORY

Twenty-one Vacancies in Sacred College and Failing Health of Pontiff. Induces Cardinals to Urge Meeting for November Next.

ROME, Aug. 10.—Although Pope Pius X had not intended to permit any formal gathering at the papal court during the year of the Italian national jubilee in order to show the resentment of the Vatican against the government's limitation of the pope's power, it is known that the leading Italian cardinals are urging his holiness to call a consistory in November to fill 21 vacancies in the sacred college. It is not yet certain whether the pope will yield.

The reason the cardinals are urging this action is that, should the pope die before the new red hats have been created, the unusual number of vacancies among their number might make it possible for a foreigner to be chosen to succeed Pius. The danger is really not very great, as the Italians are still considerably in the majority. Still, there has been a diminution since Pius' elevation in the preponderance of the Italian faction, and the defection of only a few of them might throw the balance of power into the hands of a combination of other nationalities.

The present anxiety is the result of the rapidity with which the pope's health is failing, and the liveliness of the cardinals' worry is extremely significant of the critical nature of his condition.

The cardinals, of course elect the pope, and since early in the sixteenth century following the death of the Sixth Hadrian, a Dutchman, they have always chosen an Italian.
