The plant was built in accordance with the latest information and ideas gathered by the department of agriculture and is said to be proving a great success.

It has been demonstrated that precooling of fruit is far superior to the simple icing of the cars. Uncle Sam has been conducting many experiments in connection with pre-cooled fruit and this company is the first to take the matter up in the northwest.
