

### 2000 CAMPERS CRATER FOREST

Campaign of Education Has Proved of Value as Hunters Are Exercising Greater Care in Building of Fires—500 Picking Huckleberries.

There are over 2000 people camping within the boundaries of the Crater Lake National forest according to reports received by the officials of the forest. Of this number fully 500 are camping on the famous Huckleberry mountain where an immense crop of huckleberries are being harvested this year.

With the large number of campers in the forest the officials state that the campaign of education carried on during the past year regarding careless campfire building is having its effect. The forest rangers this season have extinguished 31 small blazes the damage from which has amounted to very little. This is a remarkable record in view of the fact that there are more campers among the hills of southern Oregon than ever before in the history of the local national forest.

Hunters are meeting with much success in the forest the officials that the campaign of education carried on during the past year regarding careless campfire building is having its effect. The forest rangers this season have extinguished 31 small blazes the damage from which has amounted to very little. This is a remarkable record in view of the fact that there are more campers among the hills of southern Oregon than ever before in the history of the local national forest.

Hunters are meeting with much success in their quest for deer. A large number of the fleet footed denizens of the mountains have been killed this season but very little law violation has been reported.

At this time last season there were fires raging in all directions and forestry officials state that they have been most fortunate this year and are giving full credit to the campers who have been far more careful this year in starting fires than before.

### TELEPHONE LINE FOREST COMPLETE

Supervisor Erickson on Inspection Trip Finds Everything in Satisfactory Condition—In Touch With Outlying Districts of Forest.

M. L. Erickson, supervisor of the Crater National forest, returned Thursday evening from a long inspection trip through the forest which took him to Dead Indian, Little Elk, Mosquito, South Fork, Middle Fork, Lodge Pole and Bessie Rock. He states that he found everything in splendid condition and all of the rangers maintaining a close lookout for new fires. A number of small blazes have been discovered early and extinguished, being so insignificant that they were not reported.

Mr. Erickson made the trip primarily to inspect the new telephone lines just completed within the forest. In the Crater National forest at the present time there is over 150 miles of telephone lines, 75 miles being built this year. The lines were passed on by Mr. Erickson and found to be in a satisfactory condition. With the new lines in service the local office is in far closer touch with the outlying districts of the forest making it much easier to direct a campaign against fires should large ones start.
