How to Fry Ham and What to Fry

Most persons fry ham too long, although some prefer it served "crisp." Ham should be sliced a little less than a quarter of an inch thick. If it is sliced too thin it will char and fry hard, and if too thick it will not fry evenly all the way through. Trim off the skin all the way round very thinly. Then place the ham in a cold spider or skillet over an extremely slow fire. Allow it to cook very slowly until the lean part begins to show signs of turning a deep brown, when the ham should be re-

moved at once and placed on a warm platter. Immediately upon removing the ham, while the skillet is yet over the blaze, put in just enough cold water to take up the fat and juices that have been extracted from the ham in frying. This makes an excellent dish gravy. Pour this hot over the ham. The dish is made more attractive by garnishing with parsley.

By using the above plan your ham will be more tender and more delicious than by the old method of heating the skillet before the ham is put in.

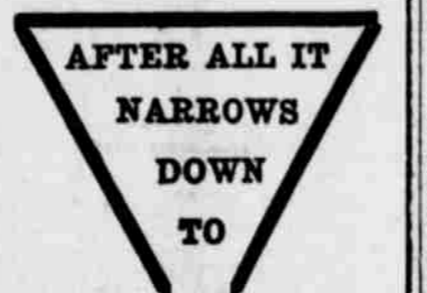
