

# It Looked Very Promising for Dickie, But It Didn't Pan Out

### CATTLE MARKET SHOWS STRENGTH

Prices Goes Up Fifteen Cents on Account of Stronger Demand—Hogs Are a Dime Higher—Little Change in Sheep Market.

NORTH PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 28.—Receipts for the week at Union Stock Yards have been: 1765 cattle, 203 calves, 1481 hogs, 6390 sheep and 17 horses. As compared with the week previous there was a decrease of 372 cattle and calves, an increase of 523 hogs, a decrease of 4000 sheep and a decrease of 23 horses.

The cattle market throughout the week was strong to 15 cents higher. If there was any suspicion of slowness in the cattle trade it applied to heavy steers. The presence on the market of an added number of butcher buyers created a demand for the lighter grades that put the market up a full 15 cents.

The hog market was a dime higher on the week, the tops having brought \$8.35. The high price was brought by a shipment from Grays Harbor that had been properly fed and were smooth and uniform. Of the 1481 hogs received only 401 came from local territory, the rest having been delivered on contract.

There was little or no change in the sheep market. There were some little deals in feeders, the farmers having realized that there was an opportunity for profit in purchasing some of the thin sheep that constituted the heavy receipts of this market. Lambs sold for \$4.80, while the low price was \$3.50 for some thin stock sheep.

### CALIFORNIA PEAR SEASON IS OVER

Most Important Shipping Sections Finish on Bartlett's and Only Mountain Districts Continue to Produce.

The California Fruit Distributors under date of Sacramento, August 26, issue the following market letter:

Peaches: 223 3-4 ears. Shipment of this variety shows a falling off of practically forty cars since last week. The decline will be even greater during the week to come. Salways will not be available in any quantity until about the 5th of September, although it may be possible to get a few carloads before that time. Not many Clings are available owing to large purchases of this stock by canners.

Pears: 208 3-4 ears. A decline is noted in the shipments of this variety, about the same as last week. The most important shipping sections have now finished on Bartlett's and shipments should show a material decrease from this time on. Vanaville and Suisun are nearly done—most of the remaining stock will be sent from the mountain districts.
