

CRIPPLED ACTRESS IS BURNED OUT

Majory Mahr, Who Lost Both Legs Under a Train Smiles at Misfortune Which Destroys Her Apartment House.

PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 28.—Though she lost both legs under a train just a little over a year ago, which ended her career on the stage and the Mahr apartments, her only means of livelihood were partially destroyed by fire Saturday, Majory Mahr today still smiles, and with splendid show of optimism today declared that it would "turn out all right."

The damage to the building, which is owned by M. Bard and Sons, is \$25,000, and the furnishings, owned by Miss Mahr, more than \$8000, partially covered by insurance.

"Two big reverses so close together does daze one a bit," said the crippled ex-actress today, "but I will weather it through somehow. I am not entirely destitute. I don't know exactly what I shall do now, but something will turn up. Of that I am sure."
