WANT DATA TO BOOST CLAIM

People of Shasta Valley Are After Trunk Highway Throughout California—Call on Jackson County for Help.

If the people of Shasta valley just south of the California line are successful in their efforts to secure the main trunk highway which is to be constructed throughout California, and from present appearances they will, it will be but another argument in favor of the passage of the \$1,500,000 bond issue in Jackson county.

That the people of Shastya county are working hard for the proposed trunk line through California is evidenced by the fact that the city authorities of Yreka have written to all of the towns of southern Oregon asking for information regarding this section. This data when compiled will be presented to the highway commission of California in order to induce them to locate the highway through the central portion of the state.

California authorized the expenditure of \$18,000,000 for the construction of state-aided roads. It is proposed to build a main highway from Oregon to San Diego. Eureka is pulling for the main highway and so is the country east of the Shasta valley. Yreka does not wish to see the road diverted, and for that purpose has called for data regarding this section of Oregon.

ORDINANCE NO. 505. An ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$24,350.00 of the improvement bonds of the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, and directing and advertising the same for sale in accordance with Chapter V of Title XXVII of Bellinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of the State of Oregon.
The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1. Whereas, the City of Medford has heretofore duly caused certain streets of said city to be improved, and has duly assessed the cost thereof to

The property benefited thereby in accordance with the charter of said city.
And, whereas, certain owners of said property have been assessed for such improvement in a sum exceeding twenty-five dollars have duly made and filed applications to pay said several assessments in installments in accordance with section 2727 of said Bellinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes.

And, whereas, an assessment and bond lien docket has been duly made up in accordance with the provisions of said section and of section 2728 of said Codes and Statutes, and the total amount of unpaid assessments for such street improvements and for which application to pay under the provisions of said sections above cited has been made and filed as aforesaid is the sum of \$24,350.00 as shown by said Bond Lien Docket:
Now, therefore, said City of Medford doth ordain as follows, and there is hereby authorized to be issued the bonds of said city in the total amount of \$24,350, in denominations of two hundred and fifty and five hundred dollars each, as may be convenient.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be made in the following form, numbered from 1001 to 1071 both inclusive:

Know all men by these presents, that the City of Medford, in the County of Jackson, State of Oregon, for value received, hereby agrees and promises to pay the bearer of the same, on the first day of _____, in the year of our Lord One Thousand, Nine Hundred and _____, without grace, with interest thereon from the date hereof until redeemed, or until the time of the next annual meeting of the next ensuing the publication of notice by the City of Medford that this bond will be taken up and cancelled and that interest thereon will cease at the interest payment period next following such publication, at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, in like coin on the first day of _____ in each year, on the presentation and surrender of the proper coupons thereto annexed, printed and interest payable at the office of the treasurer of the City of Medford.

This bond is one of a series authorized by an Act of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, entitled "An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and laying of sewers in incorporated cities and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 22nd, 1893, approved February 23rd, 1901, and is an obligation of the City of Medford, aforesaid, and is not to be deemed or taken to be within or any part of the limitation by law as to the indebtedness of said city, and it is further certified that all the requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers in the issuing of this bond, and that the total amount of this issue does not exceed the limit prescribed by said Act.

This bond is redeemable at the office of said treasurer at the option of the City of Medford upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest to the date of any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date hereof, as provided in said Act.
