THE Medford Traffic Bureau has just had notice served on it by the state railroad commission that its case submitted months ago has been consolidated with a case on its own motion which the commission has within the past month initiated, the reason given by the commission for consolidating the Medford cases with its own case is stated as follows "That the entry of an order according to the prayer of the plaintiff * * will result in unjust discrimination in favor of Medford and against other localities."
