

### TO REPAIR BEAR CREEK BRIDGE

All Hope Of Erection Of New Structure Goes Glimmering For This Fall—Planks For New Deck Are Ordered.

The county commissioners have decided that it would be impracticable and unwise to attempt the construction of a bridge across Bear creek in this city this late in the fall and have directed that new planking be placed on the driveway, the nuts tightened on the several roads and any other repairs made which will tend to make the bridge safe for travel until spring when the proposed new bridge will be put in.

Repair work will commence the first of the week. No measurements were taken for lumber with which to replace the foot path, which ought to be replanked as the present planking is worn badly in many places, and is not altogether safe, especially so for heavyweight pedestrians.

### PAPERS ATTACK RECIPROCITY

Canadian Papers Are Bitter In Denunciation Of What They Term An "Unholy Alliance"—Campaign Is Growing Warm.

OTTAWA, Ont., Sept. 16.—Bitter attacks on reciprocity with the United States are being made in the press here during the closing days of the campaign on the measure adopted by the United States congress, but to be approved by the Canadian voters.

The Montreal Star came out yesterday with a black line across the front page reading: "Champ Clark says the States want to annex Canada."

The Toronto World carries a full page line which reads: "Vote for against the unholy alliance—Laurier and Taft."

### THINK ROADS ARE TO FORCE ISSUE

Stockade Around Southern Pacific Shops Are Completed—Generally Believed That Harriman Lines Will Discharge Union Employees.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Sept. 16.—With the completion of eight foot stockades around both the Southern Pacific and Salt Lake shops here, labor leaders today profess confidence that the officials of the Harriman lines intend to force the issue, and will, within the next few days, discharge all union employees.

Despite the fact that railroad officials claim that the stockades were not built in anticipation of trouble and should have been erected months ago, local labor leaders are unable to account for the sudden activities of the company and the rush with which the stockades were constructed, unless the companies were planning some decisive move.

### CENTRAL POINT ROAD CUT UP
