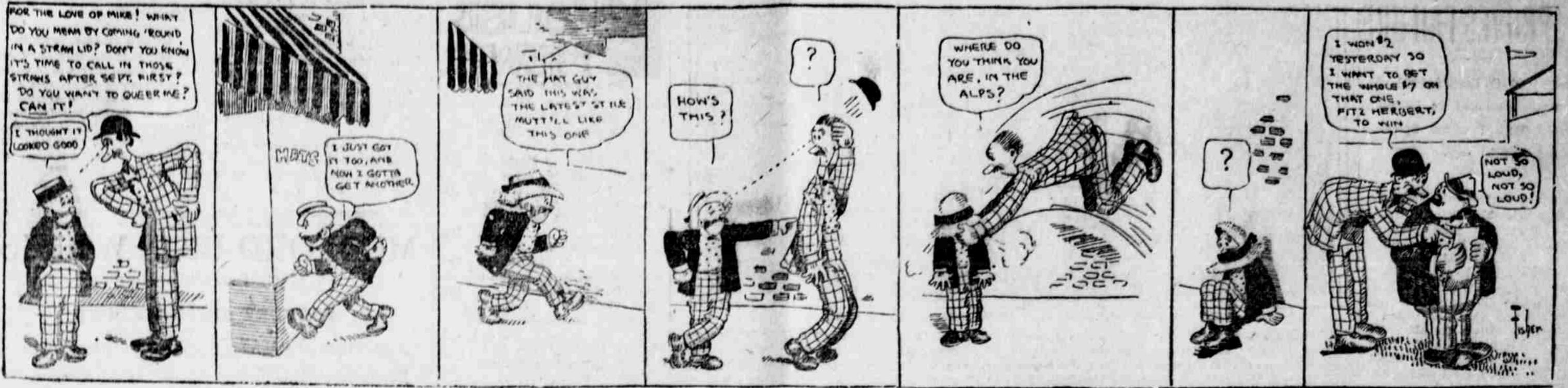

CATTLE MARKET TAKES A DROP

Strong At First Of Week Market Drops Off 10 To 15 Cents—Hogs Slump Half Dollar In Three Days.

PORTLAND, Sept. 18.—Receipts for the week have been: Cattle 2,106; calves, 237; hogs, 2077; sheep, 8116; goats, 249 and W. and M. 58.

The cattle market opened very strong the first of the week but with an unusually large run on Friday it dropped off 10 to 15 cents. Top of steer market is considered steady at \$5.50 to \$5.60 for choice heaves.

The hog market has slumped a half dollar within the last six days. Bearish reports from Missouri river markets and the receipts of a big shipment of Nebraska stock are responsible for the slump.

NOTICE OF ELECTION TO CREATE ADDITIONAL INDEBTEDNESS FOR THE BUILDING OF PERMANENT ROADS IN JACKSON COUNTY, ORE. Notice is hereby given that on the 30th day of September, 1911, an election will be held throughout Jackson county, Oregon, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Jackson county, Oregon, the question as to whether or not debts for the building of permanent roads within Jackson county, Oregon, shall be incurred in a sum not exceeding \$1,500,000 and interest thereon, and over and above any and all indebtedness of the county at the date of said election, and independent of any other indebtedness of said county otherwise created, and authorizing said indebtedness to be evidenced by the bonds of said county, dated January 1st, 1912, and payable twenty years after date and bearing a rate of interest to be determined by the county court, but not to exceed six per cent or annum, payable semi-annually, which interest may be evidenced by interest coupons attached to such bonds, and which bonds and interest coupons may be substantially in the form designated in the order of the county court for Jackson county, Oregon, calling said election, which order was duly made and entered of record in the county court of the state of Oregon for Jackson county, sitting for the transaction of county business at the regular August, 1911, term of said court, which convened on the 24th day of August, 1911, and which order was made and entered on the 30th day of August, 1911. Said election will be held in each election precinct in said county, beginning at the hour of 8 o'clock in the morning on the 30th day of September, 1911, and continuing until the hour of 7 o'clock in the afternoon of said day.
