RUSHING ROAD CENTRAL POINT

Much Progress Is Being Made By Twohy Bros.—Rogue River Canal Company Putting In Concrete Bridges Over Ditches.

Construction work on the new Medford-Central Point macadam road was commenced in earnest Tuesday morning.

The Twohy Bros., who have the contract for the construction of the road, have the thirty-foot excavation made for a distance of one mile from Medford. The road is being excavated thirty feet in width but the macadam will be only twenty feet in width. W. T. Beveridge, who is doing engineering and has supervision of the road for the county will complete the survey and cross sectioning of the road in two days. He is now at work on the Central Point end.

The Rogue River Canal company is putting in concrete conduits across the road at all high points on the route, this being done to enable the irrigating company to supply water to ranch customers on either side of the road.
