BURSUM NOMINATED GOVERNOR NEW MEXICO

LAS VEGAS, N. M., Sept. 29.—For governor of the new state of New Mexico, chairman of the republican commission, was nominated early today. He received 228 votes against 75 for Secundino Romero. On motion of Romero, Bursum's nomination was made unanimous. Following the decision of the convention, Bursum was routed out of bed by about 100 friends. He appeared, smoking a cornoc pipe, and made a brief speech. The convention adopted resolutions endorsing President Taft's attitude on the tariff.
