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CIVIL WAR IS ON IN PORTUGAL

Monarchist Uprising is Extending Rapidly—Prince Joseph Heading an Army of 40,000 Armed with Quick Firing Guns

MADRID, Oct. 5.—The Portuguese monarchist uprising is extending rapidly today according to advices received here. Prince Joseph of Braganza and other leaders are heading an army of 40,000 armed with quick firing guns, which is advancing towards Porto with a view to proclaiming it the Portuguese capital. King Manuel is expected in Portugal shortly from England. Secretary Verdi has already left London en route to the Portuguese frontier.

ORDINANCE NO. 596.

An ordinance declaring the cost of the improvement of Fifth street from Front street to Riverside avenue and assessing the same upon the property situated thereon, charging such assessment and directing the entry thereof in the docket of city court, city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. That no protests having been filed against the improvements of Fifth street from Front street to Riverside avenue, the cost of the same be paid to the council to cause said improvement to be made having been agreed, and said improvement having been ordered made, the same has consumed the probable cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$12,600.30.

Section 2. That the council further finds that the special and peculiar benefit accruing upon each lot or part thereof adjacent to said improvement and in just proportion thereto, be paid to the respective amounts hereinafter set out opposite the number or part of each lot or part thereof, and such amounts respectively, are hereby declared to be the proportionate share of each lot or part of each lot or part thereof, of the cost of such improvement, and is hereby declared to be assessed against said lot or parcels respectively, according to the name of the owner of such lot or parcel.
