LAST CARLOAD FREIGHT ARRIVES

Prospect Construction Company Has Transported Over 1200 Tons of Freight to Prospect this Summer—Large Number of Men at Work

The last contract of heavy machinery to be put in use by the Rogue River Construction company at Prospect is now unloaded at Derby, the nearest railroad point to the works.

The company has hauled by team twelve hundred tons of freight from Derby to Prospect this summer. All the heavy hauling is finished, the last carload being the dynamite for the electric power house.

There are over 200 men now employed by the company in the saw mills, flume construction and power plant. It is expected the construction work will be practically finished by the middle of November or the first of December.
