AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Improvement Bonds of the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, and directing the advertising the same for sale in accordance with the laws of the XXII of Delano & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of the State of Oregon.

THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOETH ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Whereas, the City of Medford has heretofore duly caused certain streets of said city to be improved and has duly assessed the same to the property benefited thereby in accordance with the charter of said city;

And, whereas, certain owners of property, including land, buildings, and fixtures, have made a sum exceeding Twenty-five dollars have duly made and filed applications to pay said amounts and assessments, including interest, in accordance with the laws of Delano & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes;

And, whereas, an assessment and bond upon the same has been duly made up in accordance with the provisions of section 4 and of section 2728 of said Codes and Statutes, and the total amount of unpaid assessments for such streets improvements and for which application is made under the provisions of said sections above cited have been made and filed as aforesaid in the sum of \$6250 and shown in the books of record.

Now, THEREFORE, the City of Medford doth ordain as aforesaid, and therefore authorizes to be issued the bonds of said city, the amount of which is \$6250, the sum of two hundred and fifty and five hundred dollars each, as may be convenient;

That no protests having been filed against the improvement of Third street from D'Anjou street to Agate street, due notice of the intention of the council to cause said improvement to be made having been given and said funds having been so ordered made, the council has considered the matter and herewith certifies the probable cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$6,300.00.
