

SHAKEUP IN S.P. OFFICIALS

J. D. Farrell Announces Important Changes—O'Brien to Be Relieved of Authority Over the Southern Pacific in Oregon.

PORTLAND, Oct. 11.—President J. D. Farrell of the Harriman lines in the Pacific northwest has announced important changes in the management.

The Southern Pacific and the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation properties will be segregated and a new general manager will be appointed for the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon.

General Manager O'Brien will be relieved of authority over the Southern Pacific and his jurisdiction over the Oregon-Washington system will be extended to include Seattle as well as the Portland district.

R. B. Miller will be relieved of authority as traffic manager of the Southern Pacific.

PORTLAND MEN MAY HAVE HAND IN FRAUD

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 11.—It was learned here today that the governor of Alaska has a corps of agents of the department of justice at work in Portland gathering evidence against a score of wealthy men who it is alleged are concerned in the Alaska coal land frauds.

Several of those under investigation are men high in the confidence of the administration and the majority of them are strongly identified with the republican party in Oregon.

Special United States Attorney General Townsend will leave for the east tonight and it is understood that Attorney General Wickersham and later President Taft will be advised regarding the cases and the names involved.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—Although Mrs. Martin McKenna, widow of a Southern Pacific employe, had no claim upon the railroad company, the company awarded her \$1,000 and lumber enough to build a house today.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—Minus just \$25,000 worth of love, John L. Coleman brought suit today against William Williamson, whom he accuses of having perjured his wife's affections.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—Accused of the embezzlement of \$3,500 of the post exchange funds at Honolulu, Private Eugene A. Love of the United States marine corps, was taken from the Steamer Sierra, on which he arrived here and turned over to the federal marshal.

LOS ANGELES, Cal.—Chief of Police Sebastian has received a wireless telegram from Rear Admiral Thomas, commanding the Pacific fleet, ordering the arrest of Paymaster Charles Gibbons. Admiral Thomas alleges that Gibbons is short in his accounts.

TACOMA, Wn.—Disclaiming in advance permission to enter a plea of temporary insanity, Deputy Prosecutor Buremeister is at Eatonville today, taking a statement from Mrs. Vivian Irvine, who was shot two weeks ago by Frank Calvin.

TELLURIDE, Col.—Seven miners were injured, two of them seriously, by an explosion of 20 pounds of dynamite in the Lewis mine, eight miles from here.

LOS ANGELES, Cal.—With his right arm completely severed just below the shoulder, Coxswain Charles H. Townsend of the United States torpedo destroyer Whipple is having his injuries treated at a local hospital. Townsend fell under the wheels while attempting to board a switch engine. Spurred all offers of assistance, Townsend ran down the wharf a distance of about 100 yards to where the Whipple was docked and staggered across the gangplank.
