An ordinance providing for the monner An ordinance providing for the manner on streets, county reads and public alleys in the City of Medford to pay for the cost of constructing sidewalks in front thereof. The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1.
