PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 14.—Inclined to credit the story told by Harry Howard and James Hawkins, boy tramps, in which they accuse August R. 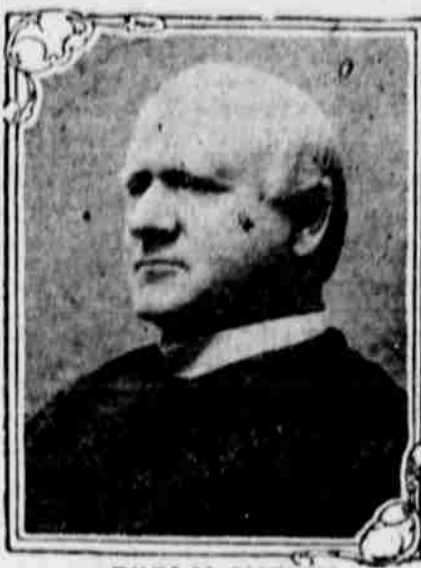
The boys were taken to Ardenwald by officers late yesterday afternoon and as soon as they got their bearings, pointed out the Hill house and described how Holmberg entered from the front while they stood outside on guard. They believe Holmberg had entered for the purpose of robbery only, and they said they did not learn of the quadruple murder until five days after they had fled and Holmberg had explained the presence of blood on his clothing by saying he had had a hard fight but had managed to get away with \$25. Until their arrest at The Dalles for theft, they said Holmberg kept them with him through threats while they travelled through various parts of the northwest.

JUSTICE HARLAN PASSES AWAY

Only Justice Marshall Exceeded in Length the Bench Term of Justice Just Dying—Was Magnificent Specimen of Manhood.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—Justice John M. Harlan of the supreme court of the United States died at 8:15 this morning.

Only Justice John Marshall exceeded in length the bench term of Justice Harlan and had Harlan lived until next spring he would have exceeded Justice Marshall's record.

The highest ambition of Justice Harlan was the chief justiceship. When President Taft appointed Justice White to the office the deceased showed no outward signs of disappointment, but his health began to fail from that time. Justice Harlan lived simply, and spent the major portion of his time in the open air. In recent years he took enthusiastically to golfing.

Justice Harlan was 6 feet 2 inches in height and in his prime weighed 300 pounds. He seemed to weaken from last spring when he went on a vacation to Murray Bay, Canada. He returned two weeks ago, very weak but not suffering from any special ailment. His physicians explained at the time that his condition was such that any illness which might attack him would make speedy inroads on his constitution.

OREGON BOY PROVES HERO

Midshipman Roach of Cruiser Colorado Saves Four Men From Drowning at Risk of His Own Life.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 14.—Herbert O. Roach, an Oregon boy serving as a midshipman on the cruiser Colorado, is the hero of the Pacific cruiser fleet today because of his work last night when, at the risk of his life, he saved four men from drowning.

Returning to the cruiser Maryland with 20 marines aboard, a navy whaleboat was struck amidships by the launch Virginia during a light fog, and capsized instantly, precipitating all of the occupants into the bay. Shriek alarm from the whaleboat's towing launch and from the Virginia quickly brought all of the available launches of the cruiser to the scene, but not before many of the men who struggled in the water were almost overcome.

WALSH PAROLE ORDER ARRIVES

Aged Banker Will Spend His Declining Years With His Son in a Small Illinois Town—Will Report Occasionally to Nearest Judge.

LEAVENWORTH, Kans., Oct. 14.—Parole order paroling John H. Walsh, the Chicago banker, serving a lengthy term in the Fort Leavenworth penitentiary was received here today. The paroling was decided upon by the prison parole board last week, but according to precedent Attorney General Wickersham held on the order for a few days.

Walsh, who is 70 years of age, will spend his declining years with his son and other relatives in a small town in Illinois.

SEATTLE, Wa.—Charles Harris, 30, was stabbed five times by an unidentified man on the street early this morning. His assailant escaped on a passing street car. Harris, who may recover, stated at the hospital that he never saw the man before and gives no motive for the assault.
