PLAIN CLOTHES MAN MAY GET JOB

City Council Will Consider Adding Another Man to Force in Effort to Head Off Petty Thieving in the Residence Section.

The city council will consider the matter of employing a plain clothes man to act in connection with the city police officials, at tonight's session of the council. For some time business men have asked that such an officer be employed, believing that he will be able to get better results in running down petty thieves than an officer in uniform. The council will also have up for consideration several ordinances declaring the cost of assessment.

Only about three minutes before the crash men were on the pole fastening guy lines and the remarkable thing is that it did not fall then. No one was injured and the work of preparing another pole was commenced this morning.
