SEATTLE, Wn.—Guy C. Stratton, walthy lumberman, three years ago recklessly ran over and killed little Henrietta Johnson. A jury tried him and found him guilty of manslaughter. The sentence was a penitentiary term and \$500 fine. Strong influences reduced the fine to \$300 and remitted the jail sentence, and since then Stratton has refused to pay the \$300. Today he was ordered committed to the county jail in default.
