

### REWARD IS PAID LOCAL OFFICERS

Bross, Cingcads and Hellan Split \$100 Reward for Capture of Burglars Who Stole Jewelry From M. J. Reddy.

Jeweler M. J. Reddy is displaying the checks in his show which he received from the Jewelers' Security Alliance as a reward for the arrest and conviction of the thief who broke into his store and stole \$1,000 worth of jewelry, for which crime, he was sentenced to a term of from one to ten years in the penitentiary at Salem. The reward will be split between Officers Bross, Cingcads and Hellan.

This organization has a membership of nearly 6000 jewelers throughout the country, each one of whom displays the brass shield in his show window, offering a reward of one hundred dollars (\$100) for the arrest and conviction of any person or persons, who may break into the store with the intention of stealing.

### JAPAN TO KEEP HER HANDS OFF

Rebels Will Be Allowed to Proceed Without Being Hampered by Nipponese—Government Troops Are Routed.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 23.—Japan has decided to keep "hands off" in the Chinese revolution, according to a dispatch received by the Chinese Free Press from its Tokio correspondent today.

This assurance that Japan will not harass and hamper the revolutionists forces under the pretext of protecting Japanese interests, added materially to the confidence of success at headquarters of the revolutionist societies here. Japan has been mobilizing a large force on the Manchurian frontier for "military tactics."

The Tokio dispatch stated that the Japanese minister of war and minister of the navy, at a conference with others of his Japanese cabinet, decided upon a neutral stand. A reported application of the Manchou government to Japan for a loan of \$5,000,000 is said to be under consideration by the minister of finance. A clash between 15,000 rebels and imperialist troops at Quang Shue, Hupeh province, resulted in a complete rout of the government soldiers, says another dispatch received by the Free Press from headquarters of the revolution in Shanghai. The imperialists broke into several sections under the attack of the rebels and were forced to retreat, badly demoralized, in several directions toward the north. The rebels pushed on and occupied the town of Chung Tai Quan.

Yeggman Make Haul. SACRAMENTO, Cal., Oct. 21.—Deputy Sheriffs are securing the country for trace of the yeggmen who last night blew open the safe of the branch postoffice in the Westinghouse Brothers general merchandise store at Nicolaus, securing more than \$400 in postage stamps and other loot amounting to \$600.

### LIGHT RECEIPTS CATTLE MARKET

One Choice Lot of Steers Sell at \$6—Steady Tone Prevails Throughout Week—Hog Market Show Slight Advance.

### EAST MEDFORD TRACT IS SOLD FOR \$4000

### AMERICAN TO CARRY MEDICINE TO TROOPS

PEKING, Oct. 23.—Dr. J. C. Ferguson, an American adviser on the Chinese board of communications is en route to join General Yin Chang's retreating army, which is fleeing from Kwang Shi Li, where they were defeated by the rebels.

Dr. Ferguson will supply the imperialists with medicines and other necessities which the retreating troops were compelled to desert in Kwang Shi Li upon the evacuation. The soldiers are reported to be in a bad way with their wounded and dying because of lack of medical supplies, and injured survivors of the battle suffering agonies with untreated wounds.

PORTLAND, Oct. 23.—A continuation of light receipts in the cattle division in the early part of the week caused some uneasiness among buyers.

One choice lot of steers reached the high point of \$6.00. There was a steady strong tone prevailing throughout.

The hog market was largely made up of supplies from the northwest territory and prices were advanced a nickel from the prevailing level of the week before.

The sheep market showed only a reasonable supply and the market was steady to strong.

### AMERICANS TO TAKE NO PART IN PRESENT WAR

PIERRE, S. D., Oct. 23.—President Taft today issued a proclamation from here, assuring American neutrality in the Italian-Turkish war. The proclamation was signed by the president today, and immediately forwarded to Washington, to be communicated to the belligerents.

"All persons under the jurisdiction of the United States will obey the spirit of the laws governing the conduct of neutrality in times of international conflict," is a part of the proclamation.

PEKING, Oct. 23.—Reports were received here today from Chang Sha and Nan Chang declaring that both those cities have been captured by the rebels after hard battle of several hours duration. These reports are given authentic confirmation.

NEWARK, N. J., Oct. 23.—If Allison McFarland is convicted of poisoning his wife with cyanide of potassium, his son Robert, aged 6, will be the principal witness against him according to the prosecuting attorney here.

Prosecutor Mott declared today that the state alleges McFarland killed his wife because he was anxious to marry Florence Bromley, a Philadelphia girl. The defendant's boy boy is thought to know much about his father's trips to the Quaker city.

The youngster and his sister are detained at the home of friends, carefully guarded against interviews.
