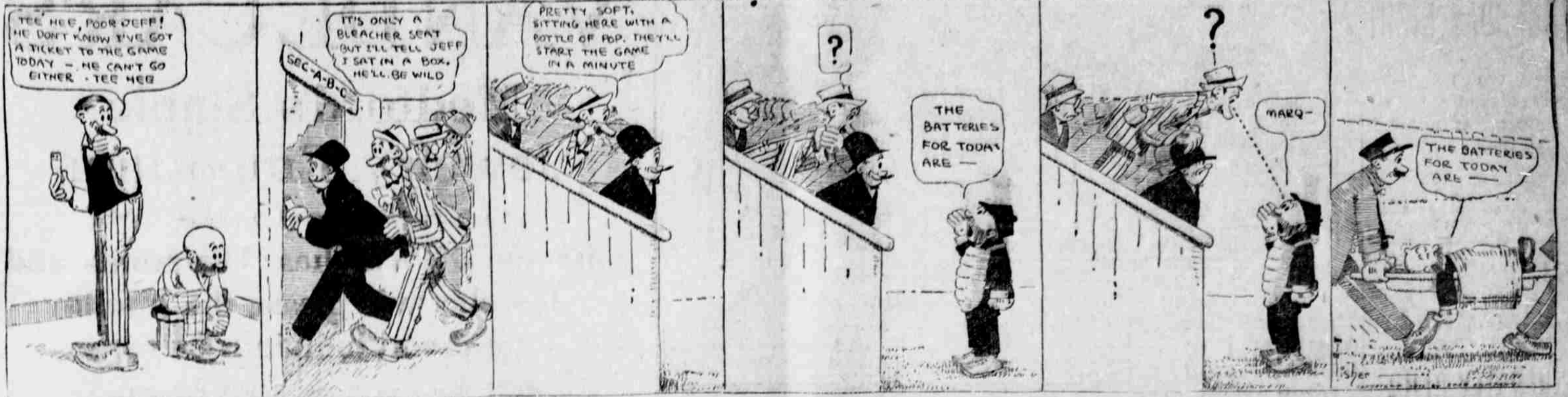

JOHN R. WALSH DIES SUDDENLY

Aged Financier Who Was Released on Parole Only a Week Ago Died Early Today in Chicago of Heart Failure.

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 23.—John R. Walsh, former banker, died here today from heart failure. The aged financier was released from the United States prison at Leavenworth on a parole signed by President Taft only a week ago last Saturday.

From the time when Walsh came to the United States in 1849, he had been chief actor in one of the most powerful dramas of finance America ever saw enacted.

In 1905 came the sensational collapse of the Chicago National Home Savings and Fidelity banks, all controlled by Walsh. National bank examiners discovered that he had employed \$7,000,000 of depositors' savings in promoting his enterprises.

After the grand jury had indicted him there began a tremendous but unsuccessful effort to prevent his conviction. Walsh maintained vigorously that he had done what he had thought best for the depositors. He was found guilty on fifty-three separate counts. From court to court appeal was taken without avail.

Walsh's friends were many and they continued from that time their efforts to free him. Finally he was released on parole.

RACE WAR IN SOUTH IMMINENT

National Guard Pushed to Oklahoma Town—One Negro Is Lynched and Two Others Are Shot—Negroes Mustering Fight Force.

COWETA, Okla., Oct. 23.—Virtual martial law here today following the lynching and threatened slaughter of 100 negro element. National guardsmen are patrolling the streets and more troops are expected during the day. It is estimated that the negroes can muster a fighting force of 2000 men, and there is every indication that a serious race war will begin here today.

City Attorney J. D. Beavers was killed and Carmen Oliver and Steller Thompson wounded while City Marshal Hart was attempting to disarm a troublesome negro, Ed Suddeth. In the ensuing melee the negro was over come and later lynched and two other negroes were shot.

CITY NOTICES

ORDINANCE NO. 599. An ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefited by the lateral sewer constructed along alley in blocks 4 and 5, original townsite, between Riverside avenue and Alley street, the cost of constructing the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessment into full effect.

Section 1. Whereas, the city council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause why they should not be assessed for the construction of said sewer, and whereas, the cost of such construction, which notice was given in accordance with said ordinance more than thirty days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protests against said construction or assessment of the cost thereof was made by any one and said sewer was, by said council, ordered constructed.

Section 2. And it is hereby ordered that the amount of the cost of the construction of said sewer has been made and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$418.82.

Now, therefore, said city doth ordain and declare that each parcel of property described below and benefited by that certain lateral sewer six inches in size, constructed on alley in blocks 4 and 5, between Riverside avenue and Alley street, and that the proportion of the cost of said sewer which each of said parcels of land should bear, based on the benefits derived respectively by said several tracts of land, in the amount set opposite the description of each parcel below, and that each of said parcels is actually benefited in the amount set opposite its description below for the construction of said sewer. The name appearing above each description being the name of the owner or reputed owner of such lot or parcel.

ASSESSMENT FOR A SIX-INCH LATERAL SEWER IN ALLEY THROUGH BLOCKS 4 AND 5, ORIGINAL TOWNSITE, BETWEEN RIVERSIDE AVENUE AND ALLEY STREET. Assessment No. 1.—H. S. Stone, lot 1, block 4, original townsite, City of Medford, Oregon; frontage 50 feet on the east side of said alley; 50 feet on the west side of said alley; rate per foot, 86 cents; amount, \$42.90.

Section 2. And it is hereby ordered and ordained that said several assessments and the liens thereon be entered in the lien docket of said city, and that thereupon notice be given to the owners or reputed owners of said property, and that the same be enforced and collected in the manner provided by the charter of said city for the collection of assessments for the improvements of streets therein.

Section 3. It is further ordered that the notice above provided for be published three times in the Daily Mail Tribune, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, in the manner provided by ordinance No. 259 of said city.
