

## REPROVED BY WOMAN HE LOVED STABLE MAN SHOTS AND KILLS

Girl's Favored Suiiter Dies at Her Feet and Then She Falls Seriously Wounded—Murderer Makes His Escape but Huge Posse Is on Trail.

SAN JOSE, Cal., Oct. 25.—Manuel Garcia, stableman, who early today shot and killed Simon Romero, a Mexican, and seriously wounded Miss Belle Quesada, was captured at noon here in a desperate fight in which he was mortally wounded, dying at the county jail.

SAN JOSE, Cal., Oct. 25.—With wild rage because the woman he loved reproved him in the presence of a more favored suitor, Manuel Garcia, a stableman employed by the rich Quesada family here, early today shot and killed Simon Romero, a Monterey millionaire, and seriously wounded Miss Belle Quesada in her home here. Garcia then took to the foothills with an armed posse in pursuit.

Garcia took one of Miss Quesada's thoroughbred horses last night and returned to the house early today, finding Romero and the girl in the kitchen over a pot of chocolate. His intrusion was resented. The girl accused him of taking her favorite horse. He admitted it. Her answer was a hot reprimand, which was cut short when Garcia drew a revolver and shot Romero through the heart. **Shoots Girl.**

Then he turned the gun on the girl and shot her. She fell.

Thinking he had fatally wounded Miss Quesada, Garcia darted for the door, when another occupant of the house appeared and grappled with him. He prevented Garcia from firing another shot at the prostrate girl, but the stableman escaped into the darkness, mounting the horse and galloped toward the foothills.

News of the shooting was carried to neighbors and the alarm spread. Poses were organized and the sheriff's office was notified.

Ranchers and the authorities joined forces and within half an hour after the alarm spread the district was being combed for the stableman. By dawn the posse numbered several hundred men. Every possible refuge in the hills is being searched and the posse is prepared for any emergency.

Sheriff Langford declares that Garcia stands very little chance of making a clean get-away, although he may succeed in eluding capture for days or even weeks if he has a source of food supply.
