TELEGRAPHIC TABLOIDS.

SEATTLE, Wn.—The receivership of the Western Steel corporation will be terminated and the works at Irondale, Wn., will soon be running, according to James A. Moore, president of the company, who has returned from the east. Mr. Moore states that he has received financial backing under a plan of re-organization which will enable the company to go forward.

SEATTLE, Wn.—By arranging with a railroad clerk to have bills made out for shipments which were never received, B. J. Cooper is alleged to have swindled the Seattle Brewing company, of which he was traffic manager, to the extent of thousands of dollars. Beer shipments were supposed to have been made, but investigation showed that the beer was not on hand, although paid for. Cooper is in jail.

PORT TOWNSEND, Wn.—James Graham, a timber cruiser, owes his life to his dogs. While on the side hill at Port Disery Bay four bears appeared. When the bears had about overtaken Graham, the dogs appeared and the bears fled.

OLYMPIA, Wn.—Whether the state under the new workmen's compensation act, must pay damages to a man who got off a train contrary to orders to get a drink, is to be decided in the case of a workman of Snohomish county, who asked the conductor for permission to jump off the front end of the train, get a drink at a nearby saloon and get on the rear end. EL CENTRO, Cal.—After the liveliest election ever held in the city, Imperial stands in favor of licensed saloons. The wets won by a majority of 60 out of a total of 290 votes. Anti-saloon people challenged many voters, but no arrests were made.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—When Mrs. Agnes L. Hughes filed suit for divorce yesterday charging her husband with having an affair, she accompanied the complaint with an application specifically asking that he be restrained from selling the family automobile.

BOISE, Idaho.—A movement is afoot here today to call an indignation mass meeting here to organize a vigilance committee to run down thugs who for three weeks have been holding up citizens and who shot and probably fatally wounded John Miller, local agent of the American Express company because he was slow in obeying a command of "hands up."

PALO ALTO, Cal.—Registering at Stanford University as a socialist, Miss Anna P. Coggins is today the first co-ed to use the privilege of woman's enfranchisement on the campus of the university.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind.—Governor Marshall of Indiana is considering today the offering of a state reward for the arrest of the murderer of Dr. Helen Knabe, former state bacteriologist and pathologist, who was found in her office with her throat cut.

SEATTLE, Wn.—W. H. Johnson bought furniture on the installment plan and lapsed in payments. One evening when his family returned the furniture was gone and the fam-

ily's clothing, silverware and Johnson's glass eye were scattered about on the floor, the glass eye broken. Johnson brought suit and today got \$25 for the glass optic.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Pauline Wayne, the White House cow, has returned from an extended western dairy show tour, on which she refused either to discuss the failure of reciprocity or the tariff issues.

BOSTON, Mass.—Mysterious circumstances have developed in connection with the death of Lowrie Good, aged 55, president of the Cairo & Norfolk railroad. The death was not reported to the police until yesterday, although the body was found the day before by Lowrie Good, Jr. Immediate cremation, requested in a paper found among the dead man's effects, will be delayed.

FRESNO, Cal.—J. K. Sheenan, a guard on the Southern Pacific railroad, was instantly killed here when an arclight in the stockade fell on his head. The lights were hastily installed when the shopmen's strike was called recently.
