## PORTLAND OFFICE TO DIRECT ROAD

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 28.—Administration of the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon will be done from the Portland office under the jurisdiction of President William Sproule with headquarters in San Francisco. This was announced this morning by President Sproule.

The chief executive of the Southern Pacific arrived this morning accompanied by Vice President E. O. McCormick, in charge of traffic. Yesterday Vice President E. E. Calvin, in charge of operation, arrived and this

afternoon and for several days perhaps, President Sproule of the S. P., and President J. D. Farrell of the O.-W. R. & N., and the vice presidents will hold conferences in regard to the separation of the administrative offices of the two Harriman properties. Presidents Sproule and Farrell held a long conference this morning.

"You can say," stated President Sproule, "that the administration of the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon will be done from the Portland offices, under my jurisdiction."

"We regard Oregon a very important field and deem it most satisfactory to have the administrative offices in Portland. We want to be closely in touch with the people. I will spend several days here making my preliminary investigation, but will

often come to Portland in the future so as to keep closely in touch with conditions and the public. I cannot say who will be placed in charge of the S. P. lines here; that is one of the matters I am now considering."

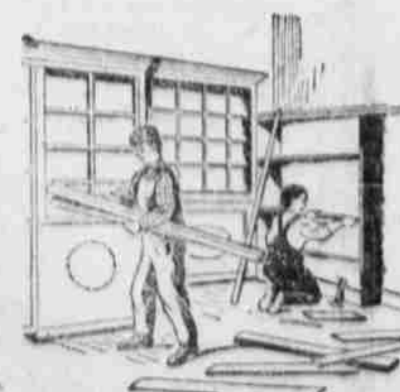
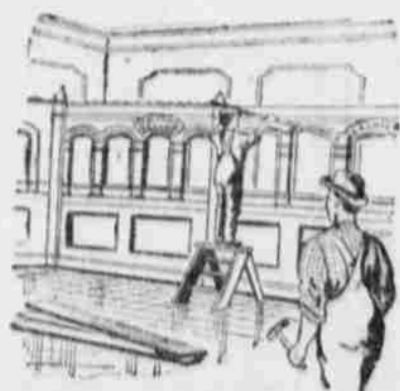
