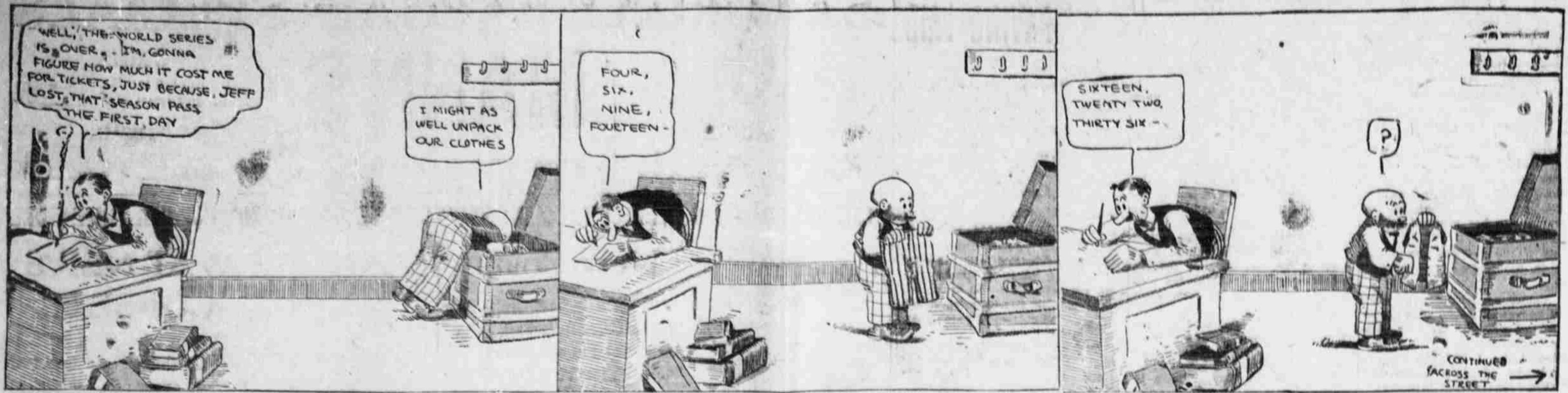

GAME WARDEN BEAT HIM TO IT

Ed Sherman States to Stranger That He Had Killed Doe by Mistake and When He Goes to Accuse Himself He Finds Complaint.

If Ed Sherman, who went deer hunting with Rev. J. T. Little of Ashland last Saturday, had not been so frank in admitting that he had killed a doe, he might have saved \$25 out of the \$50 fine which is the penalty for the offense. The two hunters hiked into the Evans Creek country and after tramping through the woods for some time caught sight of a deer's legs and part of its body half hidden in the brush. Sherman fired and brought down the game. He then discovered that he had transgressed the law by killing a doe. On their way back they met a man who inquired what luck they had and he admitted to him that they had shot a doe by mistake. They spent the night with a rancher and lost no time in hiking for Woodville, Sherman intending to file a complaint against himself and thus save half the \$50 fine. Upon his arrival before the justice, he discovered to his consternation that a complaint had been filed already. The man to whom they had confided their secret was Game Warden Hammersly and he had hit only the high places in getting down to Woodville and filing the complaint.

Declares War on Cards.
CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 3.—Thirty days in which to stamp out the distribution of objectionable post cards was given the superintendents of Chicago's sub-postal stations today by Postmaster D. A. HOME PHONE IN ASHLAND SOON

Suit to Restrain New Company From Building Into Ashland Will Not Be Pressed According to Vote of City Council.

ASHLAND, Nov. 3.—That the suit to restrain the Home Telephone company from building into Ashland will not be pressed by the city was decided at the meeting of the council, the vote being three to three and Mayor Neil casting the decisive ballot. When the company started to build its line into the city a couple of weeks ago, the business men of the city protested against the second telephone company being permitted to force a dual system on the people here. They demanded that the city press the suit started about a year ago to prevent the company's building in, it being alleged that their franchise had been rendered void because of their not having started work within the specified time. The company does not yet know positively which system it will install here, but says it intends to have it in by spring.
