

JACK FROST HITS COTTON CROP

Mercury Drops Below Freezing Point and Texas Growers Are Hahrd Hit Snow Six Inches Deep in Parts of Northern Texas.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 4.—With the mercury down to the freezing point at daybreak in nearly all of the cotton belt of Texas, it was predicted today that the cotton crop which promised to be large will be killed. Accompanying the drop in temperature was a heavy fall of snow which was general in Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas. In northwest Texas the snow is six inches deep. At Tulsa and other Oklahoma points the temperature dropped suddenly to 24 below. Twenty above zero is reported at Lower Ohio valley points.

MANY WOMEN ARE BUTCHERED

Italians Show No Mercy Even Warring on Defenseless Non-Combatants—English Lieutenant Telegraphs Particulars of Atrocities.

LONDON, Nov. 4.—"Cannot England do something to stop such horrors?" is the plea today of Herbert Montague, second lieutenant of the Fifth Fusiliers. In a news agency dispatch from Tripoli, where he is fighting with the Turks. Telegraphing from Soukel Yohma, Montague tells of Italian butcheries in Tripoli, where he declares Turkish and Arab women and children are being daily slaughtered by the Italians.

On entering and driving the Italians out of Arab houses which they were holding, Montague wires, "We discovered the bodies of 120 women and children with their hands and feet bound, mutilated, pierced and torn. Later we found a mosque filled with the bodies of women and children mutilated beyond recognition. There must have been 400 there."

Montague's telegram has given new impetus to an agitation that something be done to check the cruelties of the war in Tripoli.

After a good flight over the ocean Vaniman steered north here and watchers in the life saving station saw the balloon suddenly descend low toward the bay.

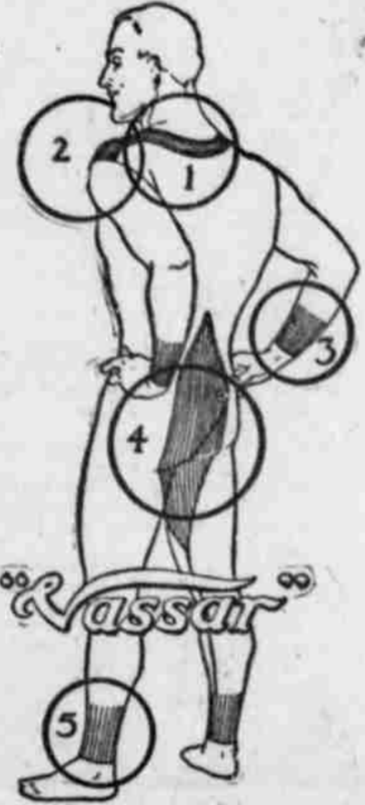
