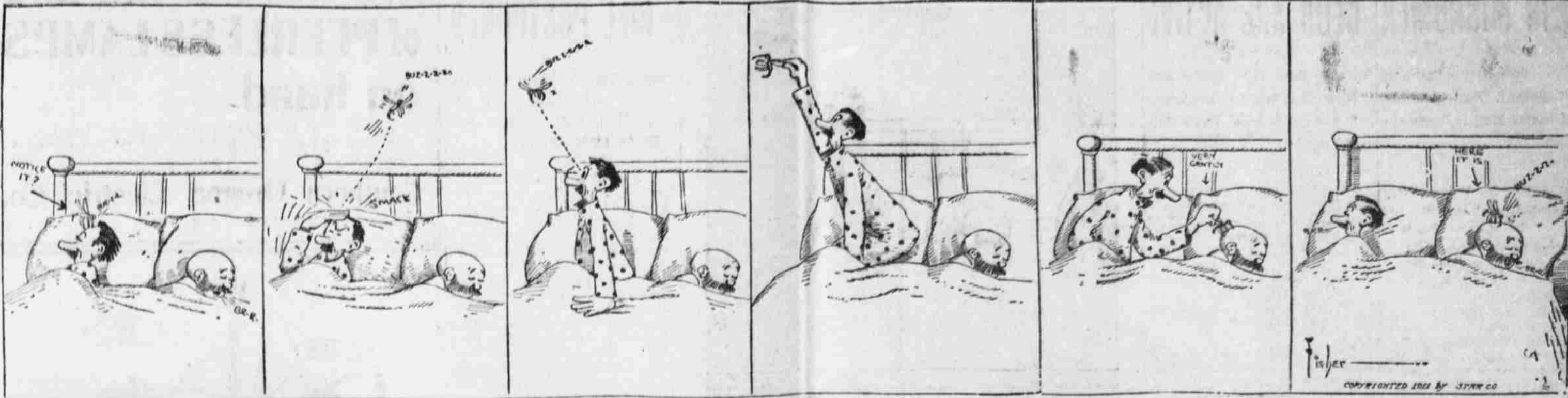

UNCLE SAM HAS UNION RECORDS

Books of the International Association of Bridge Structural Iron Workers Are Now in Hands of Federal Grand Jury.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Nov. 7.—Books and records of the International Association of Bridge Structural Iron Workers, seized in the raid on John McNamara's office here, are now in the hands of the United States authorities.

On an order issued from the federal bench by Judge Anderson today, United States marshals went to the vaults of the Indiana Trust company and obtained them. They were then placed in the hands of the federal grand jury which is investigating the dynamite cases.
