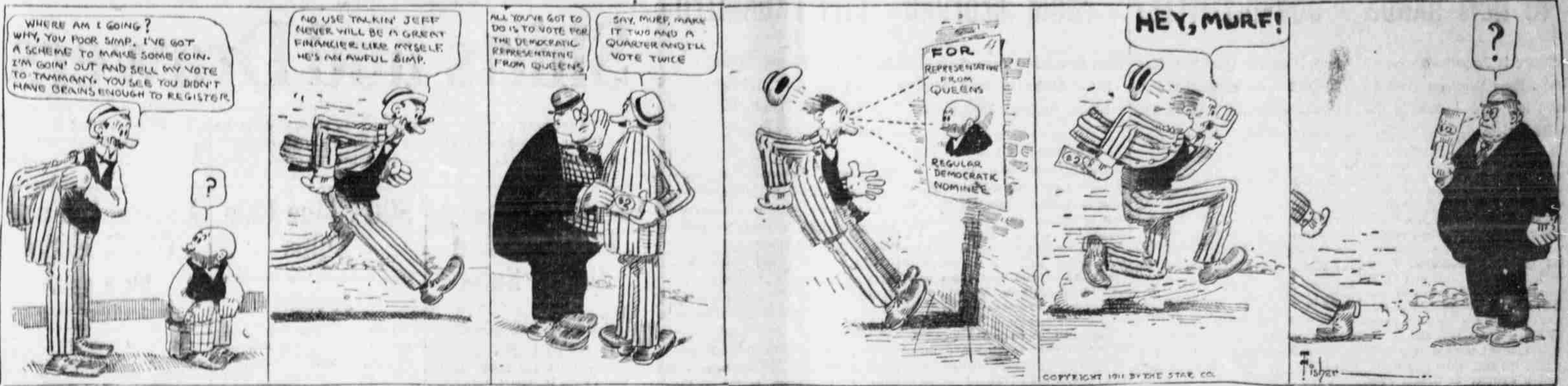

GOLDBUG TO BE GROUND-SLICED

Quartz Mine Is Leased and Will Be Operated on a More Extensive Scale—2000 Feet of Development Work Now.

The Hearn-Casey gold lodes, the Goldbug and others, in the Chetco region, will this winter get a sweeping with water, as Dan Hearn and his associates are prepared to turn a stream from Raucherie creek onto the ground, and this ground sluicing will begin when the creek begins to flow in sufficient volume.

The owners of the mining property have dug a narrow trench from creek to ledge, the length of the trench being about one-quarter of a mile. There is much broken matter and alluvial on the ground that is rich in placer gold, and this will be made to give up some of its wealth. The ledge proper is being entered with a short cross-cut, which will open it from wall to wall, thus affording a view of the mineral some distance below the surface.

A couple of hundred of dollars' worth of food supplies and other materials was recently packed to the mine from Selma, and work on the property will continue through the winter. It is stated that preparations have been made by L. G. Higgins to resume sluicing on the Golden Dream property, which lies close to the Hearn-Casey group.

ORDINANCE NO. 615. An ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$11,250.00 of the water main bonds of the City of Medford, Jackson county, Oregon, and directing the advertising of the same for sale in accordance with the provisions of the charter of said city.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Whereas, the City of Medford has heretofore duly caused water mains to be laid in certain streets of said city, and has duly assessed the cost thereof to the property benefited thereby, in accordance with the charter of said city, and, whereas, certain owners of certain pieces of property each assessed for such improvement in a sum exceeding \$15.00 have duly made and filed application to pay said several assessments in installments in accordance with the provisions of said charter, and whereas, a water main lien docket has been duly made up in accordance with the provisions of said charter, and the total amount of unpaid assessments for such water mains, and for which application to pay under the provisions of said sections above cited has been made and filed, is as follows, to-wit:

Know all men by these presents: That the City of Medford, in the County of Jackson, State of Oregon, for value received hereby, agrees and promises to pay to the bearer the sum of \$11,250.00 in gold coin of the United States of America, on the presentation and surrender of this obligation on the first day of January, 1912, in the year of our Lord one thousand, nine hundred and eleven, without grace, with interest thereon from the date hereof until received or until the time of the semi-annual interest payment next ensuing the publication of notice by the City of Medford, in the following manner: That this bond will be taken up and cancelled, and that interest thereon will cease at the interest rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of January, in each year, on the presentation and surrender of the promissory coupon hereto annexed. Principal and interest payable at the office of the treasurer of the City of Medford.

This bond is one of a series authorized by Sections 114-117-118-119-120-121-122-123-124 and 125 of the charter of the City of Medford, and is an obligation of the City of Medford as aforesaid. The city hereby covenants that it will, as authorized by section 125 of the charter, cause to be transferred from the general fund of said city section for the payment of the principal of the bonds of which this bond is one, such amounts from time to time as may be necessary to enable said fund to meet all payments payable out of the same. This obligation is not deemed or taken to be within or any part of the debt of said city, and it is further certified that all the requirements of said charter are being complied with by the proper officers in the issuing of this bond and that the total amount of the same does not exceed the limit prescribed by the act.

For fulfillment of the conditions of this obligation the faith and credit of the City of Medford are hereby pledged. In witness whereof, this bond has been signed by the mayor and attested by the recorder of the City of Medford, and the corporate seal of the City of Medford hereon attached this first day of November, 1911.
