WANT RATE EXPERTS SENT

Railroad Commission Sends Out Circulars Asking That Commercial Club Send Men Interested in State-Wide New Rates.

In connection with the hearing which the railroad commission will hold on November 15 to listen to arguments and consider complaints from shippers regarding the general freight tariffs of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company, Corvallis & Eastern and Southern Pacific lines, the commission is sending out circular letters to every commercial body in the state requesting them, if directly interested in the issue to send a representative to Salem on the date of the hearing. The commission asks that no representative be sent unless he be directly interested in the matter of rates and shipping conditions in general. This equalization of all the commodity, long and short haul and distributing rates in Oregon will be the object of the hearing, and the railroad commission is desirous every representative shall be fully prepared with necessary data in order that matters may be adjusted with fairness to both the shippers and the railroads.
