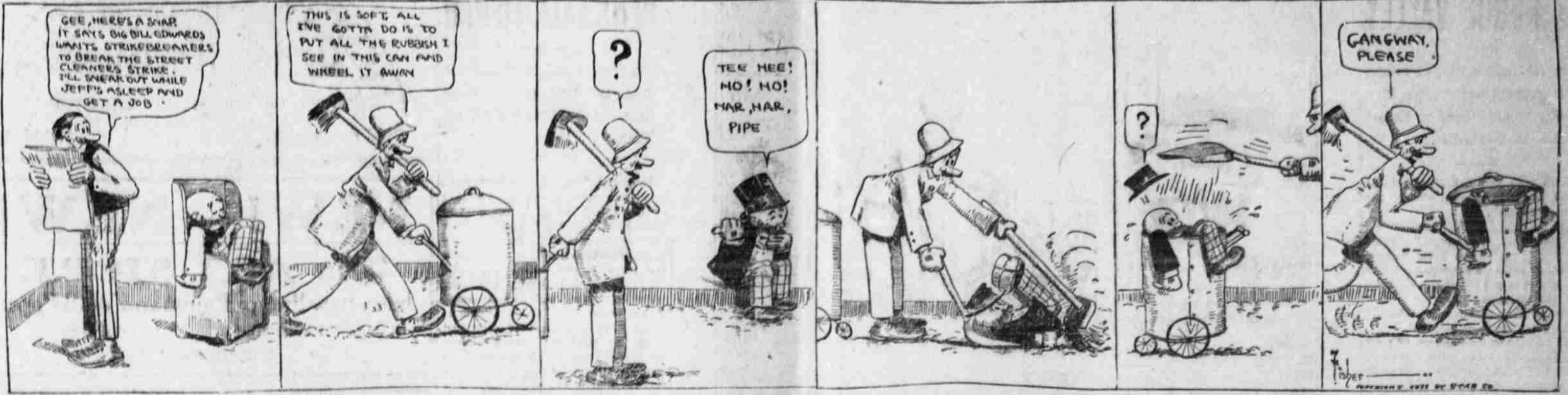


Oh, Cheer Up! The Street Cleaners' Strike Isn't So Serious at That

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 18.—The term "scab" when applied in a quiet and dignified way cannot be construed as abusive language, according to a decision of Judge Tazewell of the municipal court. The word, Tazewell said, had become legitimate by constant usage. The decision was a result of the trial of W. Watkins, a striking shipman, who, it was alleged, applied various opprobrious epithets to A. W. Farska, foreman of a gang of apathetic strikebreakers. Watkins was found guilty on the charge of using abusive language, but the word "scab" was not included. Sentence was suspended.
