

MUCH ROCK IS LAID ON ROAD

Central Point Road Is Unfit for Travel, Owing to Method Employed by Contractors in Constructing the Boulevard.

The work of laying the first course of crushed rock on the Central Point boulevard by Twoby Bros. is progressing rapidly, but it will be several weeks yet before the road is fit to travel. At present it is very rough and it will remain so until the top course of fine rock is laid.

The contractors plan to get the crushed rock laid first for the entire distance for then, despite the rain, the top course of rock can be hauled onto the road and graded. This method of constructing the road is making it very rough and unfit for travel.

Contribute Money for Benefit of Families of Policemen Who Were Shot Down While in Performance of Their Duty.

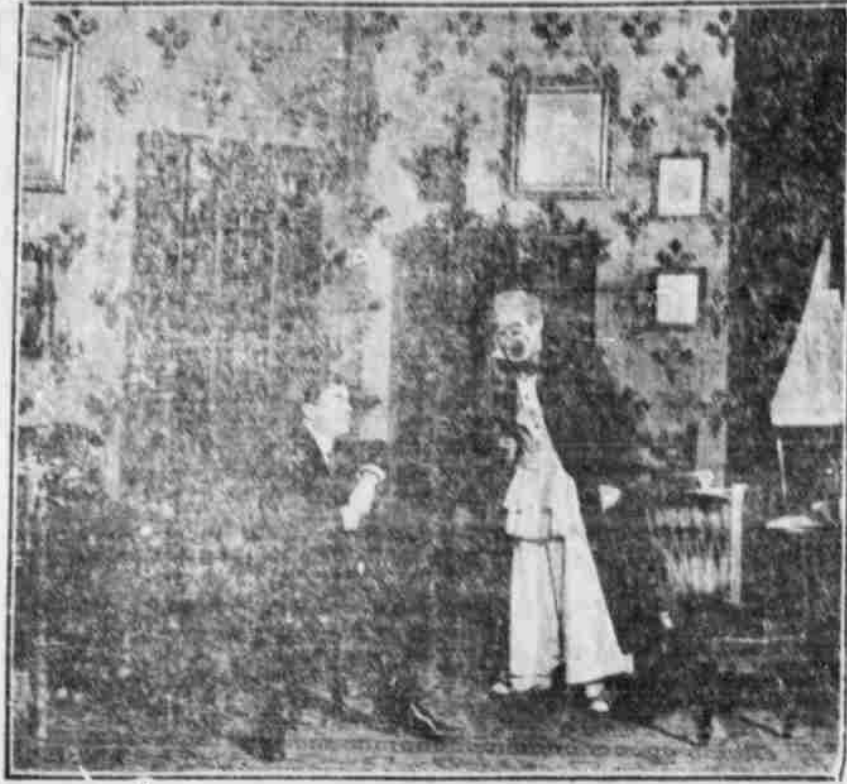
SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 1.—As a result of a "preliminary" of a new variety at the McFarland-Murphy boxing contest here, the families of Policemen Castor and Finnely are enriched today by \$1347.90. Finnely and Castor were shot down while performing their duty by a murderous Greek, whom they were attempting to arrest, last Sunday, and a benefit for their widows and children was started. The Thanksgiving spirit entered into the fans at the ringside of the McFarland-Murphy fight, and when a collection for the policemen's families was suggested \$20 gold pieces and smaller coins showered into the ring from all sides until nearly \$1400 was collected.

The total fund for the families now amounts to \$4120.

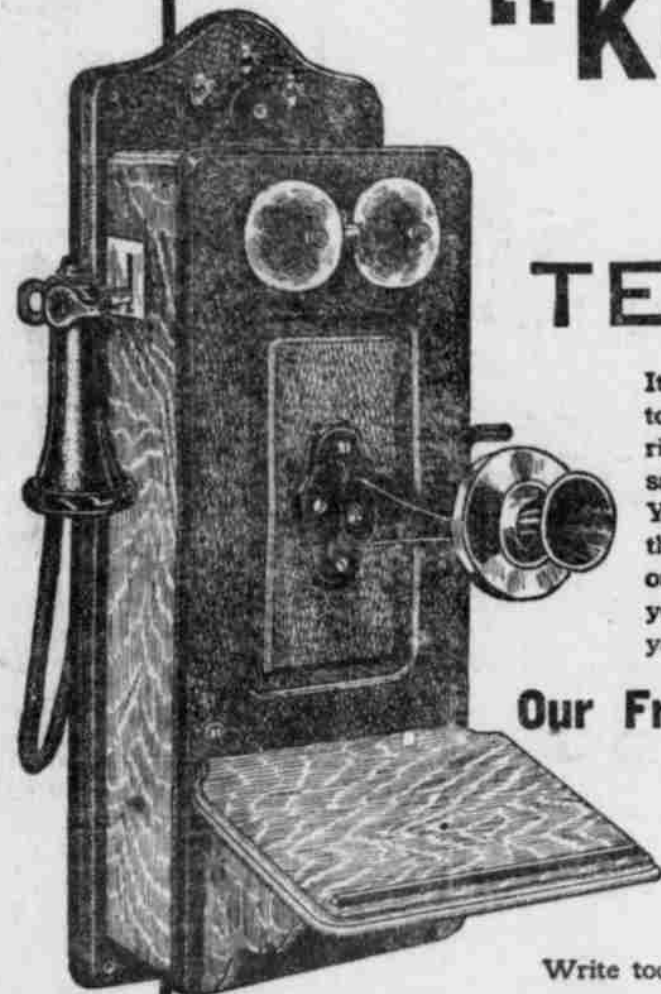
