

NO TRACE FOUND OF MISSING JUROR

Fear Waldron, Who an Away From Trial of Dr. Hyde, Has Committed Suicide—Wife Has Not Heard From Him.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 12.—No trace has been discovered of Harry Waldron, the juror in the trial of Dr. B. C. Hyde, the alleged "germ poisoner," charged with the murder of Colonel Thomas H. Swan, who escaped yesterday by climbing through a window and sliding down a water spout at his hotel, where the jury was under guard.

Judge Porterfield, who is presiding at the trial, announced that unless Waldron is found by 5 o'clock this evening he will discharge the jury and order a retrial of the case.

Waldron has not been home, and his wife declares that she has neither seen nor heard of him since his disappearance. Many believe that the man committed suicide as a result of business worries.

GRAND JURY IS AT WORK ON BIG CASE

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 12.—The federal grand jury which is probing into the dynamiting outrages went into session at 10:30 a. m., but before delving into the dynamiting cases took up a few minor Indian matters relating to the illegal selling of liquor at the Indian reservations.

Shortly after the grand jury convened Detective McLaren and Deputy District Attorney Veitch arrived at the federal building with a mass of evidence which was to have been used in the McNamara case. This was turned over to Government Prosecutor Oscar Lawler and will be used in connection with the dynamite probe.

Mrs. D. H. Ingersoll of San Francisco arrived at the federal building early and this led to the belief that she would be the first witness to go before the inquisitorial board. It was at Mrs. Ingersoll's home that James H. McNamara lived while in San Francisco.

BIG FIRE HITS ONTARIO TOWN

OWEN SOUND, Ont., Dec. 12.—In the worst conflagration that has ever visited this town the entire elevator plant of the Canadian Pacific railroad was totally destroyed last night along with 1,000,000 bushels of grain. Both elevators were leveled to the ground by the consuming flames.

The steamers Keewatin and Athabasca were saved, but not before they were badly damaged. A number of buildings in the vicinity were slightly damaged by the fire.

The loss is placed at over a million dollars.

14 LABOR LEADERS ARE MENTIONED

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Dec. 21.—Six labor leaders specifically mentioned in Otto McManigal's testimony were reported to have been implicated in the McNamara dynamiting and eight others are declared to have been indirectly involved. All live in the middle west and the east.

It is also reported that John J. McNamara sent his confederates to see various labor leaders to ascertain just where it was desired to have the dynamiting done.

Federal authorities are reported to be attempting to corroborate McManigal's statements by documents taken from the iron workers' headquarters here.

Over 35 detectives, including government secret service and operatives from William J. Burns' agency, are here.

ALL CLUBS HIT BY DECISION

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 12.—In an appeal in the case of the Bachelors' Club of Woodburn, the supreme court in a sarcastic opinion by Justice McField held that the selling or dispensing to its members of liquors by a club, in dry territory is a violation of the law. This puts all "clubs" out of commission in dry territory.

No Honesty in America.
NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—That there is no such thing as honesty in America in the present, that New York is a "den of thieves," that home life in America is all wrong and outrage is a sham are some of the statements with which Mrs. Hetty Green has given New York food for thought today. Mrs. Green was emphatic in her stand against woman suffrage.

"Women spend all their time and money on their clothes and amusements and let their homes take care of themselves," said the richest woman in America. "They are too busy trying to take men's work away from them."

City Not to Run Saloon.
COUR D'ALENT, Idaho, Dec. 12.—The supporters of Mayor Wood's idea of having the city own and operate a municipal saloon with the view of regulating the liquor traffic here was all but abandoned today.

The business men of the city have practically declared against it and are actively supporting a proposed ordinance that will arbitrarily limit the number of saloons.

LIE DIRECT IS HANDED GOMPERS

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 12.—The lie direct was applied to Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, here this afternoon by President Kirby of the American Manufacturers' association, who, before the National Business congress, compared unionism as represented by the federation of labor with the Ku Klux Klan and the Black Hand and urged the crushing of all unions.

Kirby said: "When Gompers was advised that the McNamaras had confessed he said 'I am astounded.' He told the truth. But when he said his credulity had been imposed upon, he lied.

"Not until the McNamaras had confessed and bared the horrible truth was a single protest uttered against violence by the militant labor unions or their officers. But when the terrible shock came there went up a loud cry against violence and a demand that the McNamaras be hanged. Of course this was done as a last hope to save the life of the organization in whose behalf the McNamaras perpetrated their heinous crimes."
