SA NFRANCISCO, Dec. 13 .- The most damaging evidence yet uncovered against John Rodgers, accused of murder of Benjamin Goodman in a cellar on the aBrhary coast here for the victim's \$300 in gems and jewelry was sprung as a surprise at the preliminary hearing of Rodgers this afternoon. Dorothy Foster, on the stand, told Police Judge Shortall that on the night of November 18, when it is believed Goodman was slain, she sat at a table in a Kearney street cafe near where Rodgers and his consort, Hazel Smith were seated. Miss Foster swore she saw the Smith woman tkaeal
