

OREGON BOYS HAVE ARRIVED

Four Little Freshies With Their Green Caps Make a Hit—Sing at High School This Afternoon—Concert Tonight.

After the concert at the Medford theater Friday evening the glee club is to be entertained by the University club. President Parsons and the house committee of the local club extended the Oregon boys an invitation to share their hospitality and to make themselves at home in their commodious rooms.

Vernon Vawter of Medford is the only local boy on the University Glee club. Besides singing in the base section of the club he appears prominently in the skit entitled "Maid for a Night" and in several other parts of the program offered by the club. The glee club will sing at the Medford high school this afternoon.

MADDEN MAY ERECT CANNERY

As Soon as Acreage Planted to Garden Truck Is Large Enough Capitalist Says He Will Erect a Cannery.

Most of P. H. Madden's orchard lies above the line of the proposed extension of the Rogue River Valley Canal company's extension but so thoroughly convinced is he that irrigation is necessary to successful fruit growing here that he expects to take water for his holdings and install an electric pump to raise it to his orchard. A statement to this effect was made by Mr. Madden a few days ago before leaving on a trip north, says the Herald.

Mr. Madden made the further statement that he stands ready to establish a cannery at Central Point of sufficient capacity to take care of all fruit and vegetables offered as soon as a sufficient acreage is planted to insure a reasonable amount of produce.

Mr. Madden has had wide experience in the cannery business in the east and he has unbounded faith in the commercial success of such an industry here as soon as the valley is put under irrigation and intensive tillage.

RAILROAD STRIKE MAY END SOON
