Section 1. Whereas, the city council doth hereby, by resolution, declare its intention to lay a four-inch water main on Stark street from Washington street to Sherman street and to connect the same with the water main in the city of Medford, and to amend the ordinance in that behalf passed, and the City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

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Section 1. That the proposition of the Jackson-Hadley Company, an Oregon corporation, for the laying of a sewer in a street in the city of Medford, hereinafter called the City of Medford, including excavating and backfilling the trench, furnishing and laying pipe, be and the same is hereby accepted and the mayor and council are hereby authorized to enter into and sign a contract in the form and manner hereinafter set forth, and such action by such mayor and council is hereby authorized, ratified and confirmed.

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
