CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 630.

An ordinance regulating the execution of a contract with Jacobsen-Bade company for excavating and backfilling the trench and furnishing and laying pipe for a sewer line to be laid along and in a certain street in the city of Medford, particularly named in said ordinance and providing the terms of said contract.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That the proposition of the Jacobsen-Bade Company, an Oregon corporation, for the laying of a sewer in a street in the City of Medford, hereininafter named, including excavating and backfilling the trench, furnishing and laying pipe, be and the same is hereby accepted and the mayor and recorder of the city of Medford shall enter into and sign a contract in the form and manner hereinbelow set forth, and such action by such mayor and recorder is hereby authorized, ratified and confirmed.

This agreement made and entered into this 20th day of December, 1911, by and between the Jacobsen-Bade Company, an Oregon corporation, hereininafter called the "City," and the City of Medford, hereininafter called the "City."

Witnesseth, for and in consideration of the covenants hereinabove set forth, that the contractor agrees to furnish all the necessary materials and labor and do all of the work of excavating and backfilling the ditch, laying and running pipe and following street in the City of Medford, Oregon, to-wit:

The contractor agrees to perform all of said work in a first-class, substantial workmanlike manner in accordance with the plans and specifications, now on file in the office of the City Recorder, which plans and specifications have been adopted by the city council for use with and upon the conditions in said plans and specifications set forth, which said plans and specifications are hereby agreed referred to and made a part of this agreement, and in consideration thereof the city agrees to pay said contractor at the following rates:

For furnishing and laying 6-inch sewer pipe per lin. ft. \$1.16

For furnishing and laying 8-inch sewer pipe per lin. ft. \$1.16

For constructing standard manholes, each \$5.00

For constructing standard manholes, each \$5.00

For excavating rock, per cubic yard \$5.50

The contractor shall look for payment on account of his services and shall draw into the city treasury for that purpose, and will not require the City of Medford by any legal process or otherwise to pay him any amount out of any money fund, except as provided for by the charter, unless said city shall fail or neglect to provide such funds by valid assessment upon the property affected. And the contractor further agrees that he will submit a bona fide offer of payment and accrued interest for any improvement or repair to be made by the City of Medford to pay for any of said work and if awarded said bonds that he will promptly and fully pay the same.

Upon the completion of the improvement upon these streets, according to the contract, the city shall forthwith accept the work done and pay the contractor and this contract shall be to the extent of the work done and performed considered consummated, and the city shall for ever thereafter to the benefit of the property benefited by such improvement, unless such assessment shall have been previously paid.

The contractor shall receive warrants to the amount of eighty (80) per cent of the total amount of the contracts, and warrants for the balance of twenty (20) per cent shall be issued upon the completion of the contract; said warrants to be received at the time of payment of assessment bonds or from money paid into the particular fund upon which said warrants are drawn.

It is further agreed that the said party of the first part, the contractor above named, shall furnish bond for the faithful performance of this contract, and the approved by the mayor of said city, in the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00), guaranteeing the faithful performance of the contract, and further providing for the indemnifying of said city against any claims or demands for labor, work or materials on account of any claim or demand of any laborers and others furnishing labor or material on this contract. It is further agreed that said work shall be done in a commendable manner with all reasonable diligence and dispatch and all of said work shall be completed on or before February 1st, 1912.

To witness whereof, some of the parties hereto have caused these presents to be executed on their behalf respectively, on the day and year first above written.

The money is Brown's share of \$6000 allowed Albert Mayer, L. W. Hellman, Jr., and J. Dalzell Brown for 12 years' service as surviving trustees of the Grangers' Bank of California by Judge J. J. Van Nestrant today.
