

### CITY NOTICES.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 554.

An ordinance amending the property adjacent to and benefited by the six-inch later sewer constructed along Newtown street from Eighth street to Tenth street, and amending the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessment into full effect.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the City Council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said Council and show cause, if any, why said property should not be taxed for the cost of said sewer and did file a time for hearing any such protests, which notice was given in accordance with said ordinance in the *Medford Mail Tribune*, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, in the manner provided by ordinance No. 250 of said city.

Section 2. And it is hereby ordered that the same be enforced and collected in the lieu docket of said city, and that thereupon notice be given to the owners, or their agents, of the property hereinabove described that the same be enforced and collected in the manner provided by the charter of said city for the collection of assessments for the improvements of streets therein.

Section 3. It is further ordered that the notices above provided for be published three times in the *Medford Mail Tribune*, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, in the manner provided by ordinance No. 250 of said city.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council of the City of Medford, Oregon, on the 21st day of November, 1911, and is hereby approved.
