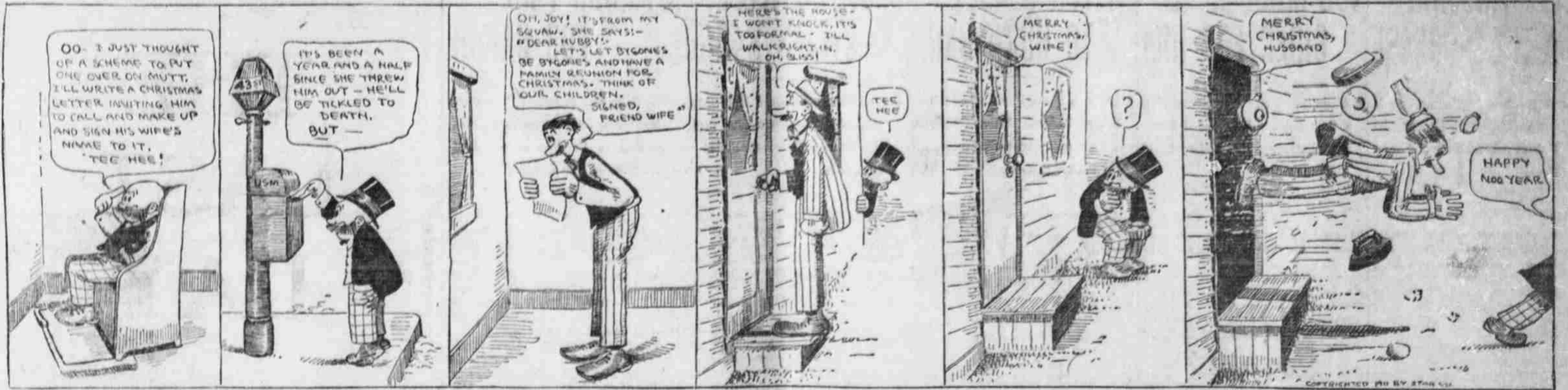


Mutt's Spouse Has Absolutely No Christmas Sentiment
