NEW YORK CHINESE CELEBRATE REPUBLIC

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—Mott street, New York's Chinatown, celebrated today the birth of the new China. A hundred thousand imported Chinese firecrackers were exploded, barrels of rice wine were consumed and rare oriental viands from the Far East were eaten in numerous banquets.
At noon the leaders of Chinatown, with "Mayor" Tom Lee at the head of the procession, entered one of the big josshouses. Chinese merchants and Chinese students of Columbia

university spoke. Then the important ceremony of the day occurred. It was the official reading of a proclamation declaring the fall of the Manchurian dynasty and the birth of the Chinese republic.
