

TRANNA SUBMITS ANNUAL REPORT

Brief Summary Is Given of Work Executed During the Past Year in City—Recommends Passage of New Ordinance.

George Tranna, superintendent of the city water plant, submitted the following annual report to the city council at its meeting Tuesday evening:

- To the Honorable Mayor and City Council—Gentlemen: The following is a brief summary of the work executed during the past season by the water department and approximate amounts of material used in repairs and new construction, including service lines:
- Seven hundred linear feet four-inch cast iron mains laid; 350 linear feet four and six inch cast iron stubs at intersections placed; 1250 linear feet 16 inch wood pipe taken up and delivered to sewer ditch; 1275 linear feet old four inch water mains taken up; 780 linear feet old two inch water mains lowered intact.
- New hydrants placed; Hydrants changed; Hydrants repaired; Hydrants moved inside curb; Gates moved from curb line; Six inch gates placed in old lines; Four inch gates placed in old lines; Six inch gates placed in new work; Four inch gates placed in new work; Gates turned on side; Gate casings cut out of paving; Dead end blow-off connections put in; Service lines pulled out by street grader and replaced; Gate valves repaired; Pumps repaired; Casing covers placed; Service lines put in (12,000 feet); Three-quarter gallon pipe; Two concrete horse troughs and drinking fountains were constructed. A new house was built at the reservoir. Old pumping plant and public toilets placed in same.
- Repairs were made from intake to city on pipe line and housing placed over pipe at Butte creek bridge.
- It is most essential to the water department that all buildings within the city limits be numbered systematically and thoroughly.
- A new ordinance that will cover all requirements is not only desirable, but most necessary. Until a new ordinance covering water rates is prepared I recommend that no permits be granted to outside users, as it is most difficult to adjust rates after water is used instead of before.
- Substantial and permanent intake requirements have been fully covered in the city engineer's report and this should be constructed next season.
- An auxiliary reservoir should also be provided, as the city has very small storage capacity and reserve will be taxed next year unless a more economical method of distribution is adopted.
- With most earnest request for action by your honorable body as to the needs of this department as above cited, this report is most respectfully submitted.
