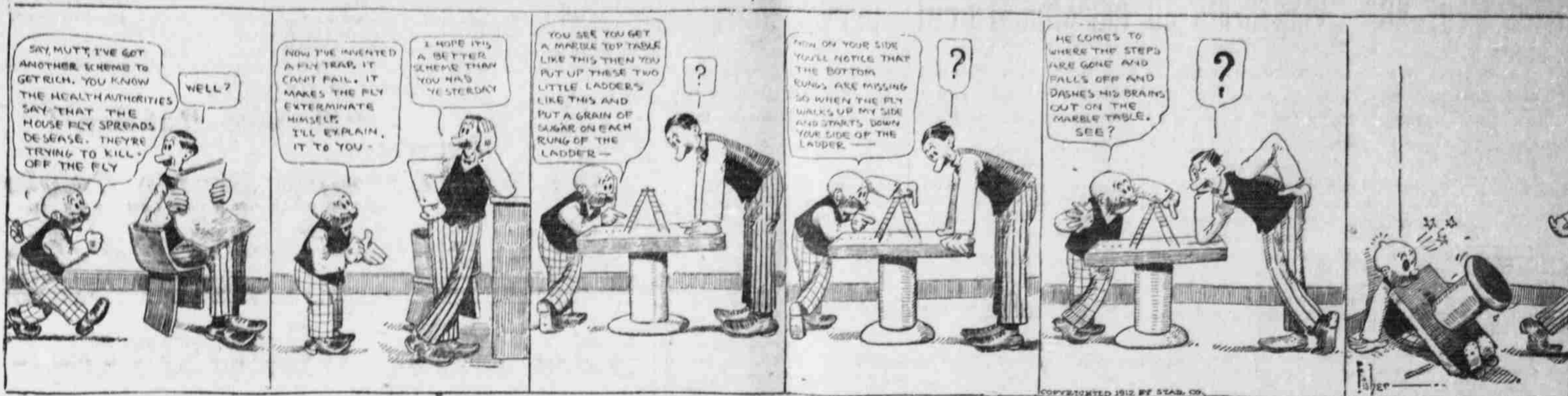

An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a water main on East Ninth street from Portland avenue west to city limits, and directing the assessor to enter a lien thereon in the water main lien docket. The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. Whereas, the city council did heretofore, by resolution declared its intention to lay a water main on East Ninth street from Portland avenue west to city limits, and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and to assess the cost of the water main on said part of said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid. And, whereas, said resolution was duly published and posted as required by section 116 of the charter of said city. And, whereas, a meeting of the council was held at the time and place fixed by said resolution, for the purpose of considering any such protests, but no protests were made at said time, or at any other time, made to or received by the council to the said laying of said water main or the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid, and said council having considered the matter and deeming that said water main was and is of material benefit to said city, and that all property to be assessed therefor would be benefited thereby to the extent of the probable amount of the respective assessments to be levied against said property, did order and direct as follows: And, whereas, the cost of said water main has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$50,141.
