OAKLAND, Cal., Jan. 25 .- "BDBy Delaney, one of the best known aporting men in the United States and the man who is credited with having "made James J. Jeffries," died at his home at 9:40 o'clock last nlight of liver transle. He passed away and apparently without anffering while asleep. The announcement of his death was not made until today.

Delaney was 58 years of age, was born in New York and came to the Pacific coast in 1875. His wife, two nurses and a physician were with him when death came. The end had been expected, as Delancy has been


