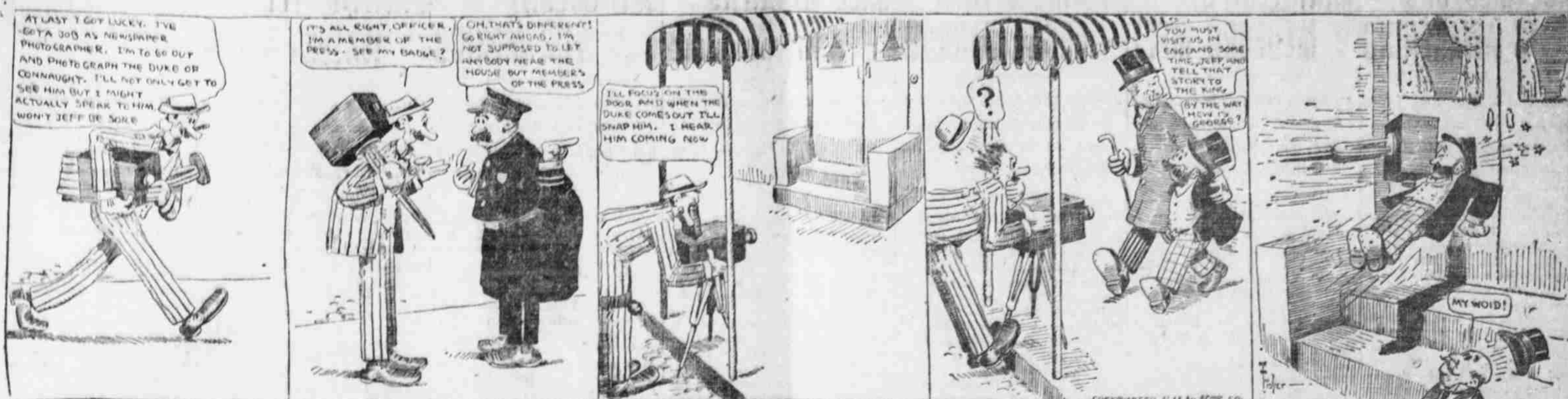


Mutt Shouldn't Let His Personal Feelings Interfere With Business
